RE: AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDING DONATIONS

LEGISLATORS HORTON, WEISS, JETER-JACKSON, MAC AVERY, and  
FARLEY offer the following and moves its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Dutchess County Health Department is mandated by New York State Department of Health, as part of the Dutchess County Health Department's Public Health Law Article 6 Program, to conduct a Community Health Improvement Plan which involves implementation of a county-wide survey, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Health has advised that Health Quest shall be a community partner by partially sponsoring the "Dutchess County Department of Health Tick-Borne Disease Community Survey 2015" which the Department of Health shall conduct as part of its Community Health Improvement Plan by contributing \$5,000, for this project, and

WHEREAS, Section 215(3) of the County Law allows the County to accept gifts of personal property, including money, for lawful County purposes, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Health requests authorization to accept said funding donations and to appropriate said funds for expenditure, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend the 2015 Adopted County Budget to provide for the receipt and expenditure of said funds, now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the acceptance of funding donations from HealthQuest to partially fund the tick borne illness survey the Department of Health will conduct as part of its Community Health Improvement Plan is hereby approved and authorized, and

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Finance is authorized, empowered and directed to amend the 2015 Adopted County Budget as follows:

McKinney's Public Health Law § 602-a

§ 602-a. Community health assessment

Effective: January 1, 2014

Currentness

1. Every municipality shall submit to the department no more frequently than every two years, a community health assessment.
2. The community health assessment shall be in such form as the commissioner shall prescribe, and shall include, but not be limited to:
  - (a) an estimate and description of the health status of the population and factors that contribute to health issues;
  - (b) identification of priority areas for health improvement, in conjunction with the state health improvement plan;
  - (c) identification of public health services in the municipality and in the community and other resources that can be mobilized to improve population health, particularly in those priority areas identified in paragraph (b) of this subdivision; and
  - (d) a community health improvement plan consisting of actions, policies, strategies and measurable objectives through which the municipality and its community partners will address areas for health improvement and track progress toward improvement of public health outcomes.
