It should be noted that there is potential for roosting of Indiana and/or Northern Long-Eared Bats in fourteen (14) trees that are to be removed through the course of the work. DCDPW was unable to remove the trees during the bat hibernation period (October - March) and the private property owner wishes the work conducted soonest so DCDPW is coordinating with USDOI-FWS and NYSDEC staff to mitigate impacts to potential roosting bats during the tree removal task within the project work. The Indiana Bat Summer Survey Guidelines (April 2016) may be applied to determine if habitat or roosting bats are present as part of tree removal work. It should be noted that the fourteen (14) trees in question are just a few of many trees within a large forested area so potential for significant adverse impact to TE bat species resulting from removal of the trees unlikely.

Also note that the extension of the existing 18" CMP drainage system using approximately five hundred feet (500') of 18" SICPP will mitigate existing erosion that is occurring on private property. This project is located within the East-of-Hudson watershed and the County of Dutchess (represented by DCDPW) is a self-regulated MS4 entity. This work will improve water quality by eliminating erosion, therefore reducing phosphorous loading and the Dutchess County MS4 Coordination Committee's EOH Subcommittee will claim credit for this work as part of the Retrofit Program for years 6-10.







Based upon our review of your inquiry received June 2, 2016, we offer the following comments:

PROTECTION OF WATERS

- There are no waterbodies that appear on our regulatory maps at the location/project site you identified.

If a permit is not required, please note, however, you are still responsible for ensuring that work shall not pollute any stream or waterbody. Care shall be taken to stabilize any disturbed areas promptly after construction, and all necessary precautions shall be taken to prevent contamination of the stream or waterbody by silt, sediment, fuels, solvents, lubricants, or any other pollutant associated with the project.

FRESHWATER WETLANDS

- Your project/site is not within a New York State protected Freshwater Wetland. However, please contact your town officials and the United States Army Corps of Engineers in New York City, telephone (917) 790-8511 (Westchester/Rockland Counties), or (917) 790-8411 (other counties), for any permitting they might require.

STATE-LISTED SPECIES

- No records of sensitive resources were identified by this review.


