

Arlington Town Center Pedestrian Plan



What is this project?

The Arlington Pedestrian Plan seeks to improve pedestrian access to the Town Center, enhance the pedestrian experience in Arlington, and establish a vision for what the Town Center could look like – ultimately creating a walkable, pedestrian-friendly Main Street. The Plan consists of two parts: 1) an inventory of sidewalks and other infrastructure in Arlington (completed this spring), and 2) a plan with prioritized recommendations to make Arlington better for walking (to be completed this winter). The Plan is being led by the Poughkeepsie-Dutchess County Transportation Council (PDCTC), in coordination with a local Task Force.

The Plan focuses on the Main Street corridor between Grand Avenue and Taft Avenue, but includes the entire Arlington Town Center (see back).
