LOCAL EMERGENCY ORDER # 12

OF EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2 of 2020

WHEREAS, a State of Emergency was hereby declared in the County of Dutchess effective on March 13, 2020, by Emergency Executive Order No. 2 of 2020 due to a case of COVID-19 being confirmed in the County,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the powers vested in me as County Executive by Article III of the Dutchess County Charter, Section 3.05(d) of the Administrative Code and pursuant to the provisions contained in New York Executive Law Section 24, which authorizes the Chief Executive to promulgate Local Emergency Orders upon a finding that the public safety is imperiled by the event of a public emergency or in the event of reasonable apprehension of immediate danger thereof, to protect life and property and to bring an emergency situation under control;

NOW, THEREFORE, by the power vested in me as Chief Executive of Dutchess County, it is hereby ordered:

SECTION 1: SUPPORT REOPENING OF FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS:

- In order to support the reopening of food service establishments and to cope with the economic disaster caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, and subject to Federal, State, and Constitutional statutory and regulatory limitations, as well as State and County health and sanitary laws, rules, and regulations, I hereby order that all cities, towns, and villages within the territorial limits of the County of Dutchess may reopen food service establishments pursuant to the following conditions. Cities, towns, and

villages within Dutchess County may reopen such establishments without regard to the strict adherence to local land use laws, rules, and regulations, which are more particularly described in Exhibit A which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Such suspension of the appended local laws, ordinances and regulations shall be subject to the terms and conditions as determined by each individual municipality. Cities, towns, and villages should first give consideration to the propriety that this permissive order may have on individual communities.


SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE:

I, Marcus J. Molinaro, the County Executive of Dutchess County, in accordance with a declaration of a State of Emergency issued on March 13, 2020 and pursuant to Section 24(2) of the New York State Executive Law, do hereby order that this Local Emergency Order shall take effect on Tuesday, June 9, 2020, 12am through June 13, 2020 at 11:59pm.

SECTION 3. DURATION.

This Order shall remain in effect until removed by the order of the County Executive and may also be renewed in five (5) day increments.
