The Chairman called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Roll Call by the Clerk of the Legislature

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Clerk read notice of public hearing.

The Chairman declared the public hearing open.

Brian Doyle, Chief Executive Officer of Family Services, stated that his organization provides crime victims assistance, domestic violence services, relapse intervention for sex crimes, domestic abuse awareness classes for men, and sexual assault forensic examinations, supervised visitation, and after school programs for elementary school students. He added that many of the aforementioned services received funding from or through Dutchess County. He stated that the County Executive's budget reflected a continuation of these services and urged the Legislature to ratify the same budget. He also spoke in opposition to building a new jail and asked for a council similar to the Criminal Justice Council to be appointed on how best to address this issue.

Constantine Kazolias, 47 Noxon Street, Poughkeepsie, spoke in opposition to building a new jail. He also spoke on the reduction of the 2 percent sales tax revenue going to the City of Poughkeepsie. He stated that cutting the sales tax revenues would result in the layoff of employees. He added that privatizing garbage would cost the city residents more money. Comments attached hereto and made a part of these minutes.

Linda Keech, Executive Director of Cornell Cooperative Extension, asked for support for

the County Executive's proposed new agency partner competitive grant program that will be coordinated through Dutchess County's Planning and Development, outlined on page 467 of the budget and looked forward to submitting a proposal for the benefit and continued well being of Dutchess County.

Jody Miller, Executive Director of the Mediation Center, spoke on appreciation of the new proposed competitive grant process.

Fred Bunnell, Poughkeepsie resident, commended the County Executive for a transparent form of government and opening up dialogue with constituents. He appealed to county government to change the criteria of how it was decided where cuts to the budget were made and where cuts to the budget were not made. He spoke in favor of Cornell Cooperative Extension and the basic needs that they provided to the community. He also urged a special counsel of criminal justice to work collaboratively with non-profits, government agencies, and the school systems, to explore the roots of so many of our human needs.

There being no one else wishing to speak, the Chairman declared the public hearing closed.

The public hearing was adjourned at 7:36 pm
