Resolution 2018288, A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,424,000 SERIAL BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF DUTCHESS, NEW YORK, TO PAY A PART OF THE COST OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE DUTCHESS COUNTY STADIUM, IN AND FOR SAID COUNTY, was offered and defeated at the November 13, 2018, Board Meeting, and reconsidered and adopted on December 3, 2018.

Discussion on November 13, 2018, proceeded as follows:

On motion by Legislator Houston, duly seconded by Majority Leader Sagliano, discussion on Resolution No. 2018288 proceeded as follows:

Assistant Minority Leader Munn called point of order to allow everyone to say their peace and move forward.

The point of order was not recognized by the chair who had already acknowledged Legislator Edwards for her remarks.

Legislator Tyner stated that none of this money should be going to pay-to-play.

Legislator Miccio called point of order because this resolution was not about pay-to-play.

At this time, Chair Pulver entertained a motion from the floor, which was seconded and carried, for a Democratic Caucus.

Discussion on December 3, 2018, proceeded as follows:

Chair Pulver requested Legislative Counsel to review the requirements to reconsider a resolution.

Legislative Counsel Volkman stated under our rules and under Roberts Rules a motion to reconsider is appropriate under certain conditions. This meeting is a viable avenue for a motion to reconsider. The basic rules are that a motion to reconsider must be made by someone who voted with the prevailing side on the resolution in question. So, in this case, the resolution was defeated so the prevailing side is anyone that voted no and I believe that there were nine no votes so any one of those nine members who voted no can make the motion to reconsider. It has to be seconded, but anyone can second it no matter how you voted on the first resolution. It is debatable. The merits of the underlying resolution can be considered at that time. It requires a majority vote so even though this vote requires a majority vote to pass a motion to reconsider simply requires a majority vote. Once there is a vote on it, if it's successful, then the debate can continue on the merits of the underlying resolution and a vote on that will again require a two thirds majority vote or 17 at that time.


EXECUTIVE SESSION
