



Dear County Officials and Taxpayers,

The Dutchess County Comptroller's Office has completed a review and summarization report of all major capital projects in progress as of December 31, 2021. This will be the first of a three-part series of reports on capital project spending, planning, and its associated debt costs. Our goal is to ensure transparency and accountability as it relates to capital project spending and planning.

The Comptroller's Office routinely audits and reports on capital projects completed and in progress as it is a large use of taxpayer funds. Capital projects are often viewed, approved, and reported on independent of one another, but it is important to routinely take a holistic look at all capital projects so that we can understand their impact on current and future county finances and resources.

There are 67 open capital projects at various stages of completion currently projected at a cost of \$460.8 million. Over the last ten years, open capital projects have increased by \$168 million or almost 58%. There are an additional \$104.5 million in new capital projects planned for 2022, as per the 2022 Capital Program adopted by the Legislature in November 2021.

Of the projects slated to begin in 2022, the most notable are: (1) Emergency Response's \$30 million consolidated two-way radio project, (2) DPW-Buildings' \$15 million Youth Opportunity Center (The YOU), and (3) DPW-Parks' \$10 million Poughkeepsie Urban Trail. There is also a \$3.1 million resolution being discussed to fund the purchase and design costs of a new emergency housing facility on Oakley Street in Poughkeepsie.

Our office will continue to monitor and report on these projects as they develop.

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I. Background

Capital projects are long-term, capital-intensive investment projects. They are defined by their large scale and large cost relative to other investments that involve less planning and resources. The Comptroller's Office routinely audits and reports on capital projects completed and in progress, as it is a large use of taxpayer funds. Over the last ten years open capital projects have increased by \$168 million¹ or almost 58%.

The current amount of open capital projects as of December 31, 2021, is \$460.8 million of which \$129.7 million remains to be appropriated (Exhibit I). The projected total gross costs for new capital projects in 2022 are \$104.5 million, as outlined in the 2022 Capital Program adopted in November of 2021 (Exhibit II).

Capital projects are most commonly funded by the issuance of debt but can also be funded (or partially funded) by Federal, State, or County funds. According to the 2022 Capital Program, the County's net indebtedness as of December 31, 2021, is projected to be \$198.8 million, with an additional \$134.7 million² authorized but unissued. Annual principal and interest costs for 2022 is projected to be \$19.8 million³.

II. Scope & Objective

Our objective is to report on the major current open Buildings and Parks capital projects authorized over \$1,000,000 which had activity as of December 31, 2021. We will summarize each of these major projects and report the revenue and expenses as of December 31, 2021. Projects administered by the Dutchess County Department of Public Works Buildings (including Hudson Valley Regional Airport and Dutchess Community College) and the Parks Divisions were reviewed. Road, bridge, equipment, home, and community service projects were not reviewed, but are summarized in Exhibit I.

This report will be the first of a three-part series on capital spending. Our second report will focus on the importance of a Five-Year Capital Program and compare actual capital projects which have commenced, to the projected Capital Program for 2017-2021. Our third report will focus on debt service for the current capital projects and its financial impact for the next several years.

III. Methodology

Our review included comparisons of the County financial system (Budget Performance Reports), authorizing Resolutions, and the County Capital Plan.

Funding Details

Resolution #2016271 authorized \$8,089,000 construction costs of which \$1,812,445 in County bonds and a transfer of \$2,250,000 from General Contingency for this project to pay the County's portion. NYS matched cost at \$4,044,500. Resolution #2018285 dated November 2018 authorized an additional \$2,525,000 in serial bonds from the County (NYS share is \$2,500,000), as the revised estimated cost of the project increased to \$13,089,000. In August 2019, an additional \$1,262,500 in serial bonds was authorized by Resolution #2019222. Both the 2018 and the 2019 resolutions were rushed to the Legislature and required a waiving of the rules of the legislature to be voted on. Resolution #2020183 dated December 2020 authorized the transfer of the assets, liabilities, and balance of the budget in the Airport Capital Project EA0501 to the newly created HC0501 fund effective January 1, 2020. This transfer was recommended by the Dutchess County Commissioner of Finance in order to conform to standard accounting principles. As of December 31, 2021, a total of \$14,633,950.72 had been received for this project.







Petition for redress of grievances submitted pursuant to Article 1 Section 9 of the New York State Constitution, and the 1st Amendment of the United States Constitution, for Violations of New York State Election Law

I, the undersigned, do hereby state that I am a New York State Citizen, and that I voted in the New York State General Election on November 3, 2020, and that I remain a duly enrolled voter registered in the voter rolls of New York State, and that my place of residence is truly stated opposite my signature hereto, and

I do hereby petition the following personnel for a written, meaningful response to this petition: Attorney General Letitia James, NYS Board of Elections Commissioners, Peter S. Kosinski / Co-Chair, Douglas A. Kellner / Co-Chair, Andrew J. Spano / Commissioner, Anthony J. Casale / Commissioner.

This petition is for a redress of violations of the following provisions of the NYS election law.

The agencies and individuals listed above are the authorities having jurisdiction for the following election law violations:

- 1. 17-126. Misconduct of election officers.
- 2. 17-136. False returns; unlawful acts respecting returns.
- 3. 17-152. Conspiracy to promote or prevent election.
- 4. 17-104. False registration.
- 5. 17-132. Illegal voting.
- 6. 17-160. Procuring fraudulent documents in order to vote.
- 7. 17-170. Destroying or delaying election returns.
- 8. 17-150. Duress and intimidation of voters.
- 9. 17-168. Crimes against the elective franchise not otherwise provided for.
- 10. 17-124. Failure to deliver official ballots.
- 11. 17-154. Pernicious political activities.

The factual evidence in support of this petition for redress includes the following:

Facts:

1) The official vote count for the 2020 general election certified by the Secretary of State, 8,690,614, does not match the number of voters who voted in the New York State voter rolls, 8,418,179, nor does it match the number of votes from the New York State precincts, 8,627,153, with a minimum discrepancy of 272,435 votes, contrary to Election Laws 17-126 and 17-136,

see exhibit (a). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.

- 2) These violations resulted in many races being certified where the discrepancies exceeded the margin of victory, contrary to Election Laws 17-126, 17-136 and 17-152, see exhibit (b). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 3) The New York State Board of Elections in 2021, pursuant to a formal request, provided a copy of the voter rolls. Analysis by our team, lead by a PhD, found 1,899,730 state registrations in nine counties (Bronx, Duchess, Erie, Kings, Nassau, New York, Onondaga, Queens, and Richmond), that are missing from the voter rolls maintained by the corresponding County Board of Elections, contrary to Election Laws 17-126, 17-136, and 17-152, see exhibit (c). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 4) Voter rolls maintained by the New York City Board of Elections as well as Dutchess and Onondaga Counties, show 195,271 votes cast in the 2020 General Election that are not recorded in the New York State Board of Elections voter rolls, contrary to Election Laws 17-104, 17-126, 17-132, 17-136, 17-152, 17-160, 17-170, and 17-124, see exhibit (d). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 5) Voter rolls maintained by the New York State Board of Elections show 28,369 votes cast in the 2020 General Election in Erie and Nassau Counties that are not recorded in the voter rolls maintained by the corresponding County, contrary to Election Laws 17-104, 17-126, 17-132, 17-136, 17-152, 17-160, 17-170, and 17-124, see exhibit (e). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 6) New York State Election Law Chapter 17, Article 5, Title 5, Section 500, paragraph 2 clearly states each voter shall be issued "...a registration serial number which shall be different for each voter." The data provided by New York State voter rolls (see 1 above) clearly shows 608,757 unique State Board of Elections Identification (SBOEID) numbers assigned to 299,920 unique

voters. 65,759 of these SBOEIDs, attached to 32,417 voters, are not only an exact match with first name, last name, and date of birth, but also address. These facts are contrary to the Election law stated, see exhibit (f). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.

- 7) At least 10,458 of these registrations (see 6 above) voted, allowing 5,229 unique voters to exceed one vote per person in the New York State 2020 General Election, contrary to Election Laws 17-104, 17-126, 17-132 and 17-160, see exhibit (g). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 8) Voter rolls maintained by the New York State Board of Elections contain at least 1,488,224 purged voters with no purge date, of which at least 31,180 voted in the 2020 New York State General Election, contrary to Election Law 17-104, and 17-132 and/or 17-136, see exhibit (h). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 9) Six New York State counties had in excess of 100% voter registration during the 2020 general election (Allegheny, Erie, Hamilton, Nassau, Westchester, and Wyoming), and 51 additional counties had over-registration in certain age categories, resulting in at least 625,359 excess registrations, contrary to Election Law 17-104, see exhibit (i). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 10) 27,638 voters registered after the deadline of October 9, 2020, yet voted in the New York State 2020 General Election, contrary to Election Law 17-132, see exhibit (j). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 11) There were at least 620,610 blanks added or subtracted after the certification of the New York State 2020 General Election, contrary to Election Laws 17-126, 17-136 and 17-170, see exhibit (k). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.

Petition for redress of grievances submitted pursuant to Article 1 Section 9 of the New York State Constitution, and the 1st Amendment of the United States Constitution, for Violations of New York State Election Law

- 12) New York State voter rolls contain at least 19,706 deceased voters, of which 1,284 voted in the New York State 2020 General Election, and 10,289 of which were born on January 1, 1850, contrary to Election Laws 17-104, 17-132, 17-136 and 17-150, see exhibit (l). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 13) New York State 2020 General Election contained in excess of 88,241 irregular votes, contrary to Election Laws 17-126 and 17-136, see exhibit (m). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 14) Analysis of the voter turnout in the New York State 2020 General Election using the Dr. Frank age/turnout method reveals a 6 factor polynomial constant can predict the voter turnout by age with an average 99.3% degree of accuracy. This demonstrates that the turnout records are not organic, contrary to Election Laws 17-126 and 17-168, see exhibit (n). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 15) The state and at least 14 counties have denied multiple FOIL requests for election records from the 2020 New York State General Election, contrary to Election Law 17-150.
- 16) The state and 1 or more counties have admitted to destroying various election records of the 2020 New York State General Election in violation of the law, contrary to Election Law 17-152, see exhibit (o). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.
- 17) According to a sworn statement, a box of official New York State 2020 General Election ballots was found unsealed and without chain of custody in an apartment building, on or about November 8, 2020, contrary to Election Laws 17-124, 17-126, 17-152, 17-170, see exhibit (p).
- 18) 44 Candidates for the New York State Legislature in New York City and Westchester County, all representing the Democratic Party, were unopposed by the Republican Party, contrary to Election Laws 17-126, 17-152, 17-154, and 17-168, see exhibit (q). I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified.

Petition for redress of grievances submitted pursuant to Article 1 Section 9 of the New York State Constitution, and the 1st Amendment of the United States Constitution, for Violations of New York State Election Law

Duchess County Facts:

- 1) Duchess County voter rolls maintained by the New York State board of Elections demonstrate that a 1,274 voter discrepancy exists between the Duchess County precinct vote tabulation count and the New York State Board of Elections, and a 767 voter discrepancy exists between the Duchess County precinct vote tabulation count and the New York Secretary of State certified results. Additionally, a 507 vote discrepancy exists between the New York State Board of Elections and the Secretary of State regarding Duchess County. I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified in Duchess County.
- 2) Duchess County voter rolls maintained by the New York State board of Elections demonstrate that there are 8,485 duplicate SBOEID numbers assigned, 78 of which voted. Petitioners claim each of these registrations and votes deprived petitioners of equal protections under the law.
- 3) Duchess County voter rolls maintained by the New York State Board of Elections demonstrate that 87% of the voting age population of Duchess County is registered to vote. The following age groups from 18-100 have in excess of 95% registration: 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 61, and 68. The following age groups from 18-100 have in excess of 100% registration: 74 (101%) and 100 (116%). Petitioners claim these registrations deprived petitioners of equal protections under the law.
- 4) Duchess County voter rolls maintained by the New York State board of Elections demonstrate that 2,384 people voted without a residence address in their voter roll. Petitioners claim these votes deprived petitioners of equal protections under the law.
- 5) Duchess County voter rolls maintained by the New York State board of Elections demonstrate that 713 people registered after the cutoff date, and voted on election day. Petitioners claim these votes deprived petitioners of equal protections under the law.
- 6) Duchess County voter rolls maintained by the New York State board of Elections demonstrate that at least 23 people voted who were deceased. Petitioners claim allowing these votes deprived petitioners of equal protections under the law.
- 7) Duchess County voter rolls maintained by the New York State board of Elections demonstrate that at least 2 people voted who were older than the oldest living resident of the United States.

Petitioners claim these votes deprived petitioners of equal protections under the law.

- 8) Duchess County voter rolls maintained by the New York State board of Elections demonstrate that 319 people voted from 4 schools. Petitioners claim these votes may have deprived petitioners of equal protections under the law.
- 9) That the total number of irregular votes in Duchess County, as detailed above, is 4,793 votes.
- 10) Analysis of the voter turnout in Duchess County using the Dr. Frank age/turnout method reveals a 6 factor polynomial constant can predict the voter turnout by age with a 99.9% degree of accuracy. This demonstrates that the turnout records are not organic. I assert this fact, alone and/or in combination with any of the other facts presented herein, proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the 2020 General Election was defective and must be decertified in Duchess County.

Those petitioned are hereby requested to provide a meaningful response by refuting each of said facts or complying with the relief specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 below.

- 1. Decertify the New York State 2020 General Election.
- 2. Full Forensic audit of the November 3, 2020 New York State General Election, for a complete investigation of the efforts made to subvert the will of the people.
- 3. Criminal and financial penalties and enforcement for those officials involved.

Should the recipients hereby petitioned not publicly respond to the Petition within thirty (30) days of service by granting the relief requested, such a violation of their constitutional duty would add credence to the belief held by petitioner that a Government that first violates the rule of law and then fails to honor its obligation to respond to a Petition for Redress of the violation is unrecognizable – that is, it is not the Government the People instituted. Consequently, petitioner questions why he/she should continue to fund a Government that has stepped outside the boundaries drawn around its power by the terms of the State Constitution and laws pursuant thereto. Upon failure to respond accordingly or provide the remedies requested within 30 days, the undersigned is faced with a government that was not duly elected. As a means of enforcement of our rights, New York State Sovereign Citizens reserve the right and are entitled to withhold remittances to New York State until a redress of these grievances are performed by the authorities having jurisdiction.

TABLE OF VOTE DISCREPANCIES ALPHABETICAL BY COUNTY



TABLE OF OVER-REGISTRATIONS BY COUNTY



Introduction

Dr. Frank

Dr. Douglas G. Frank has approximately sixty peer-reviewed scientific publications, including feature and cover articles in the leading scientific journals in the world (*Science, Nature, Naturwissenschaften*). During his graduate and postdoctoral work he discovered and developed a new type of microscopy capable of producing three-dimensional images of molecules resting on metal surfaces. This gave him international credibility in the area of Low Energy Electron Diffraction (LEED) and Auger electron spectroscopy and microscopy, and his work is prominently featured in college textbooks and handbooks on the subjects.



Dr. Frank Replication

In the year 2021, Dr. Frank made numerous presentations of an analysis he made of 2020 election results in several states. Those states included Ohio, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Arizona, and Colorado. He did not make a presentation regarding election results in the state of New York.

Dr. Frank's study showed that voter turnout by age was unnaturally homogeneous for all counties within any given state. The results were so homogeneous that he could use a curve derived from the results of a few counties to accurately predict the results in any other county in the same state. For instance, if the

curve showed that 32.598% of registered 27 year old and 43.003% of registered 41 year old voted in the sampled counties, then the same percentage of registered 27 and 41 year old voted in every other county. To visualize this, he produced graphs to show the percentage of registered voters at each age, from 18-100, that actually voted.



To show how well the prediction curves matched actual results, Dr. Frank ran a correlation analysis. The result of the analysis is called an "R-value". An R-value can be any number from 1.0 to -1.0. A value of 1.0 means that the two things compared are identical. A value of -1.0 means they are identical but reversed. A value of 0.0 means they do not correlate at all. The R-values in Dr. Frank's analyses tended to be very high, anywhere from about. .98 to 1.0. The high R-values he achieved indicate a strong positive correlation. That is, his predictions of registered voter turnout by age were nearly identical to the actual results.

What this means is that Dr. Frank was able to create a prediction of "82" separate values representing voter turnout percentage for each age between 18-100. That group of 82 predictions correlated with actual results in every county in each state with a very high R-value. This result, according to Dr. Frank, "is not natural". Dr. Frank's conclusion is that the high level of predictability and overall homogeneity of voter turnout indicates artificial control of results via an algorithm. If this is true, then the certified results cannot be legitimate.

NYCAPAC Replication

The citizens' group NYCAPAC used Freedom of Information Law (FOIL) requests to obtain voting records for the state of New York. Census records were obtained directly from the census bureau's website. Notably, NYCAPAC received voting records from two separate sources: The New York Board of Elections (NYBOE) and directly from county Board of Elections (County). Data provided by NYBOE included voter histories and age information for all 62 NY counties. Many counties either did not respond to FOIL requests or provided partial data. For that reason, NYCAPAC was unable to obtain county-provided data needed to perform a Dr. Frank replication from many counties. Data presented here is based on NYBOE records.

Petitioners rebuttal of published Criticism of Dr. Frank's analysis

Several critics have published their own analysis of Dr. Frank's election analysis. Below are three examples:

From ConstitutionalPolitical.org (https://www.constellationpolitical.com/blog/dr-frank-analysis-wrong/):

1. "All of the data he based his original analysis on is verifiably false.

¹ Dr. Frank repeatedly uses the number "82" to describe the number of predictions, though there are 83 numbers between 18-100.

- 2. He claims that his analysis produces the same result regardless of the data it's based upon.
- 3. He has refused to disclose the "6th order polynomial" that produces his predicted ballots cast.
- 4. Improperly compares 2020 registration totals to 2010 Census data.
- 5. Arrived in Colorado knowing his data was bad and intending to present it regardless." (emphasis original)

Petitioners Response:

- 1. The claim that Dr. Frank used false data is based on the fact that data downloaded by the anonymous author of the article doesn't match figures used in a video presentation by Dr. Frank. Links to the data used by Dr. Frank and the author are located at the bottom of the article. Both have been disabled, making it impossible to compare them. Many Boards of Elections report that vote totals can be and are revised in the weeks and months after an election. It's likely that Dr. Frank and the critic downloaded their data on different dates, between which the data was updated by the board of elections. This happened in the NY Citizens Audit PAC (NYCAPAC) analysis as well, initially leading to the concern that a mistake had been made entering the data. An associate of Dr. Frank's, Draza Smith, verified that this is what happened.
- 2. The claim that Dr. Frank's results are the same regardless of the data used to generate them is overly broad. More accurately, the claim is, "Dr. Frank's results for this county aren't materially affected when updated data for the same county is substituted." In the NYCAPAC replication, we found that the data used did affect the results. For instance, R-values for county-provided data were consistently higher than for state-provided data for the same counties. It may be that the updated data in Dr. Frank's sample did not affect the distribution of votes by age.
- 3. Dr. Frank is not required to disclose the 6th order polynomial he used. The fact that he did not present it is not evidence that his analysis is incorrect or falsified. NYCAPAC was also able to extract a 6th order polynomial to generate predictions of voter turnout by age for New York. It is presented below (figure 1)




Figure 1NY 6th order polynomial

- 4. The basis for the claim that Dr. Frank improperly compared "2020 registration totals to 2010 census data" is the census itself. According to the author, the census does not provide population by age. Instead, it provides population by age group by combining people in five year groups. It is true that the census provides census data on the population in five-year age groups. It is also true that it provides ungrouped population data though it takes more effort to find that data. The author believes that the averaged five year groups are not accurate enough for a reliable analysis and that Dr. Frank's method for breaking them out by year would introduce error. Regardless of Dr. Frank's methodology (unknown to NYCAPAC), NYCAPAC did not average this data. Instead, we used the raw ungrouped data found on the census' website.
- 5. The claim that Dr. Frank "knew his data was bad and presented it anyway" presumes that Dr. Frank agrees with the author's analysis. It also presumes that the author's analysis is correct. If either or both of these presumptions are false, so is the claim. From the evidence available to NYCAPAC, it appears that Dr. Frank did react to either this criticism or one like it by correcting his data and revising his presentation. This may not have happened before the presentation criticized by the author of the article.

Summary of claims published in the Constellation Political blog:

From the article... "...Dr. Frank's data was bad, therefore his analysis cannot be reliable.

Dr. Frank manipulated the data to make it more homogeneous, thus increasing the R-value. Dr. Frank agreed that both of the previously stated criticisms are true but presented his analysis regardless...."

Petitioners Summary response

The author of the blog is unaware of the voter roll and census data actually used by Dr. Frank. Therefore, he cannot know for certain whether his analysis is correct. He does make an inference based on a screen capture from a video but Dr. Frank is reported to have since corrected that error, rendering the point moot. Dr. Frank does not present the 6th order polynomial mentioned in his presentation but this is not evidence of anything. The criticism does not apply to the NYCAPAC replication because we do present the 6th order polynomial.

The Washington Post (https://www.washingtonpost.com/politics/2021/04/12/how-people-who-should-know-better-abuse-math-bolster-election-fraud-lie/)

Columnist Philip Bump of The Washington Post wrote an article published April 12, 2021 to criticize Dr. Frank's election analysis methodology. According to Bump, Dr. Frank was able to accurately predict voter turnout by age because that type of behavior is inherently predictable.

To illustrate his point, Bump uses the hypothetical example of sandwich sales at a deli. The goal in Bump's example is to predict future sandwich sales based on data recorded for one day's sales over time. For instance, x number of sandwiches sold at 9 am, y sold at 10 am, etc. The curve produced from the sample data show ascending sales from 9 am until lunchtime, after which, sales decline until 5 pm. There is some variety from one day to the next but it is clear that the curves for each day's sales will correlate with a very high R-value.

The problem with Bump's example is that it fails to simulate the conditions related to voter turnout, nor how it varies by age. In the deli example, there is a reason for sandwich buyers to increase in number as they approach the lunch hour, and then decline afterward. In voting, there is no articulated reason why voters of different ages would turn out in equal ratios relative to the number of registered voters in any given county.

Bump goes on to misstate Dr. Frank's thesis. Bump writes that Dr. Frank's analysis shows that, "a prediction of how many votes would be cast in a Michigan county by age derived from the number of votes cast in a Michigan county by age correlates with the number of votes cast in a Michigan county by age." This is not true. Dr. Frank's actual claim is that voter turnout by age can be predicted in every county in a state based on census and registration data for other counties in that state. What is peculiar is that the recorded turnout suggests that people in each of 83 different age groups turn out in almost identical proportions in every county, regardless of all other factors that might influence their behavior. The article correctly states that Dr. Frank averaged data from four counties to predict turnout by age in remaining counties. By doing this, Dr. Frank ensured strong correlations to his averaged counties. However, this does not take into account variability between counties. Regardless, this criticism does not apply to the NYCAPAC methodology because we did not average data. Instead, NYCAPAC used 2 counties, not averaged, to predict turnout in 2 distinct regions of New York state. Queens county served as the "key" county for New York City, and Albany county was the key for the remaining 56 counties. An article written by Bump in 2015 provides a graph representing voter turnout by age in California. This is presented as evidence that Dr. Frank's curves follow a similar pattern, proving that voter turnout by age is predictable. However, the curve in the 2015 article is an average of all California counties. Therefore, it suffers from the same problem Bump accuses Dr. Frank of. Secondly, although there are generic similarities in the overall direction of the curve it lacks the detail of the curves used by Dr. Frank, which go up and down in tiny increments. It is the difference between placing a grapefruit into a bowl and saying that their shapes match "pretty well" and putting a grapefruit into a bowl that has been molded

from the same grapefruit, where every pit and bump matches. Stated more simply, the Bump example smooths away all of the detail that make Dr. Frank's analysis interesting.

NYCAPAC replication

Dr. Frank's election analysis is as compelling as it is controversial. At the heart of controversy surrounding it is the question whether his methodology observed normal voter behavior. If voters behave predictably at different ages, then the high R-values produced by Dr. Frank's analysis are normal.

For instance, the shape of a Porsche Carerra automobile would match the shape of a weather protection cover designed for the same vehicle. Therefore, it would be no surprise if an R-value generated for the correlation between those two shapes was high. However, a protective cover for a VW bus would not match the shape of a Porsche Carerra, a BMW X7, a Ford Mustang, or a Buick Skylark. What Dr. Frank's data appears to show is that voter turnout by age is one-size-fits-all, as if every voter behaves the same at different ages no matter who they are, what race they are, what their interests are, level of education, gender, access to voting, employment status, etc..

If his critics are correct, either Dr. Frank's methodology will produce a high R-value with any data set, or voter behavior by age is so homogeneous that it is absolutely predictable. In the first case, this would be like throwing a flexible elastic sheet over a multitude of cars. It may not match perfectly but its elasticity would allow fair conformity to cars of a similar size. In the second example, it would be like a world that had only one car company and it produced only one design. Neither is plausible.

NYCAPAC decided to attempt a replication of the Dr. Frank election analysis to answer this question.

The goal was not to prove that his analysis was correct but to learn whether it genuinely predicted natural human behavior that should not be predictable. To succeed at the first prong of our analysis, we had to be able to predict voter turnout by age in various NY counties, based on a curve extracted from one of those counties. To succeed at the second prong, we needed a very tight "fit" that would capture small deviations in turnout by age. The idea behind this is that voter turnout by age might be broadly predictable but not

with a high degree of specificity. This is the difference between an elastic car cover and one designed for a specific car.

This zip file contains many files, but there are two needed for this analysis.

- ny000172010.sf1 This file contains population categories of the population by age.
- o This file is in comma-separated format.
- o The format of this file is documented I the sf1.pdf document above under the category, "PCT12 Sex by Age".
- o The Logical Record Number (LOGRECNO) in this file is important because this links the numbers by sex and age with their meaning and context, which comes from the other file, nygeo2010.sf1.
- nygeo2010.sf1 This file provides context of the numbers provided in the other files in ny2010.sf1.zip.
- o Each record in this file represents the context for data provided in the other files. The two key values indicating the context are the Characteristic Iteration (CHARITER) and the Logical Record Number (LOGRECNO).
- o To find the data by county, I found it useful to use the CHARITER value of 510. Records will this CHARITER value provide data by County or part of a County. There are more than 62 records with CHARITER=510 because many of these records provide information for only part of a county.

Steps needed to extract the population data by age from these files.

1. Make a copy of the nygeo2010.sf1 file and remove all the records that don't contain "NY510" in bytes 7-11.

- a. Scroll to the right, you will see that each remaining record represents a county or part of a county.
- 2. Match the LOGRECNO values in the nygeo2010.sf1 file with the LOGRECNO values from the remaining records (with "NY510")
- 3. Merge these two files by LOGRECNO, removing any records from ny000172021.sf1 which don't have a matching LOGRECNO.
- 4. Summarize the resulting data by County, summing the information by sex and age for each county. (At this stage, keep the data by sex as well as age. This is needed for mortality projections later.)

Adjusting the 2010 Census data to 2020.

Adjust the 2010 Census data to 2020.

Since the election of interest occurred in 2020, we need to adjust the data. Two steps are needed.

1. Move the results ahead 10 years.

a. For this, simply add 10 years to each age, giving you data for ages 10 and above. This is OK because people

need to be at least 18 years old to vote.

2. Adjust for mortality

- a. For this, I used the Actuarial Life Table from the Social Security Administrator. https://www.ssa.gov/oact/STATS/table4c6_2010.html
- b. This table provides to probability of death within one year for each age. A table is provided for most years from 2010 to 2020. For years that were skipped, I used the average of the surrounding values for each age.
- c. Note that the values for male and female are significantly different. For this reason, I chose to add the mortality based on sex as well as age.
- d. Because the other census data showed increases in populations under 60, I chose to only apply mortality only to people who were more than 60 years old in 2020.
- e. For both male and female, for each age from the time they reached 60, I applied the probability of death for each of the 10 years from 2010 to 2020.

- f. Once the mortality has been added, we no longer need to track this information by sex. Generate a table by age where each cell contains the sum of the male and female people at that age in 2020.
- 3. The resulting table provides the age pattern from 2010 adjusted 10 years. This table contains the shape of the population information we need for all the counties in NY.

Adjust to the 2019 County Population for each county

Now that we have the population shape for each county based on the 2010 census, we need to adjust this to the actual population in 2020. In my case, I chose to use the county population for 2019 since I believe that planning for the election probably took some time. My thinking is that the bad guys had easy access to the 2019 estimates, but might not have the 2020 data soon enough.

For each county, I simply adjusted the population of each age proportionally to reach the known 2019 population. The result is a table with an array of populations based on age for every county in New York.

Projecting Voters by Age for Counties

Now we have the population data we need as a basis for projections of voters based on the population or the registered people.

To retrieve the number of registered people by age, use the registration data for the county. Find the file called, <county>_Registered_Sum_by_Age.csv. In the 5 NYC borough this registration data information comes from the file <county>_VoterData.txt.

To retrieve the number of voters by age, use the vote data by county. Find the file called, <county>_Voters_

Sum_by_Age.csv. In the 5 NYC boros this voter information comes from the file <county>_VoterHistory.txt.

There are two forms of projection we are interested in.

- 1. A projection directly from our Population (based on the 2010 census) and the number of voters. This is important because for many counties we only have voter information, we don't have information about people who are registered but did not vote.
- 2. A projection from the number of registered people to the number of voters. This is the projection that seems to fit very well with a 6th order polynomial equation. This value is important because we believe it is used to regulate the use of phantom voters during the election counting.

Select a Base County

First, select a County to be the base. In this case, we chose the Bronx to be the base count. For the base county:

- Compute the ratio from the voters to the estimated population by age (ratio A[x] = voters[base,x] / population[base,x], for x=18..110)
- Compute the ratio from the voters to the registered by age (ratioB[x] = voters[base,x] / registered[base, for x=18..110)
- Graph ratioB by age. This is the "key" for conversion from Registered to Voters. Add a trend line and set this to a 6th order polynomial. Note how closely the trend line fits with the ratioB data by age.

For each other county, use the ratioA and ratioB values from your base county to project the voters. To provide a projection apply the same ratios for each age that were computed from the base county.

- Compute Projection1 using ratioA values (projection1[county,x] = ratioA[x] * population[county,x], for x=18..110)
- Compute Projection2 using ratioB values (projection2[county,x] = ratioB[x] * registered[county,x], for x=18..110)
- Compute the correlation coefficient between Projection1[county] and voters[county].
- Compute the correlation coefficient between Projection2[county] and voters[county].
- Provide a graph showing the population, registered (if available), voters, projection1 and projection2 (if available) by age.

Notes

After completing the analysis of NY counties, the NYCAPAC team discovered national averaged population by age data. As an experiment, all NY counties were processed again, this time using a prediction curve that incorporated the national data instead of the more specific (and accurate) county data.

Due to high variability in voters under 40, two R-values were calculated. One is for the full population between ages 18-100, the other for ages 40-100. Also, county census values for ages 18-19 and 20-25 were averaged.

Findings

Curves generated by the NYCAPAC methodology strongly correlated with the base "prediction curve" generated based on data from Queens county. This satisfied the first prong of our test: Dr. Frank's analysis could be replicated using New York data.

The quality of fit in many counties was too strong to be attributed to normal human behavior.

Curves based on averaged national data more accurately predicted voter turnout by age than more accurate county data.

Conclusion

It is implausible that averaged national population data would yield stronger correlations than more accurate data specific to individual counties. This implies that reported turnout, when broken down by age, was more influenced by the national census than the population of any given county. That effect is more consistent with artificially-imposed control than natural human behavior.

The fit correlation is very strong in most counties, meaning that is possible to predict voter turnout by age within a very small margin of error. Given the variability observed in the curves produced in this study, it is unlikely that a single curve derived in part from one county could so exactly predict behavior in other counties.

The reason is that the decision to register, and then to vote, vary according to unique personal circumstances, many of which are beyond the control of the voter.

Even if one assumes that all 62.567% of all 40 year-olds, 59.778% of all 41 year-olds, and 63.74% of all 42 year-olds intend to vote, There are many obstacles that could prevent some of these people from voting. For instance, they could be unconscious in the hospital, engaged in unexpected business, traveling away from home (and uninterested in filling out an absentee ballot), stuck at the site of a traffic accident, arrived at the polls after they close, etc. Those factors are unrelated to a person's age. For that reason, the number of people affected in each age group should not be predictable.

For the "natural" hypothesis to work, it would mean that either 1) voter turnout by age is predictable to a high degree and that no voters were prevented from voting by unforeseen circumstances, or 2) voter turnout by age in combination with unforeseen circumstances that affect access to polls is predictable to a high degree by age.

Put another way, this assumes that either a statistically negligible amount of voters were affected by unforeseen circumstances or that unforeseen circumstances and voter behavior are highly predictable by age.





RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATURE AND GOVERNOR TO ENACT S.5331 (STEC) / A.857 (JONES) AND S.8189 (HINCHEY) / A.9164 (KELLES)

WHEREAS, many counties throughout the state are experiencing significant staffing shortages in emergency medical services, jeopardizing the community emergency response to those in need of assistance; and

WHEREAS, Senator Dan Stec and Assemblymember Billy Jones have introduced legislation that would authorize municipalities, including counties, to establish a special district to finance and operate general ambulance services; and

WHEREAS, this legislation would also require the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (DHSES) Commissioner to identify challenges concerning volunteer emergency services or personnel; and

WHEREAS, by authorizing counties to establish special districts, this legislation would increase the quality of emergency protection services in New York State with economies of scale, particularly in the Adirondack region and the rural regions; and

WHEREAS, in addition to Senator Stec and Assemblymember Jones' legislation, Senator Michelle Hinchey and Assemblymember Anna Kelles have introduced legislation that would establish a CHIPS-based funding formula for municipal EMS districts; and

WHEREAS, a 2013 analysis by the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) found that, while the average scene-to-destination time throughout New York State was 13.16 minutes, some parts of the Adirondacks have significantly longer wait times. The average scene-to-destination time is 17.77 minutes in Clinton County, 18.32 minutes in Franklin County, 21.59 minutes in Warren County, 25.55 minutes in Essex County, and 53.46 minutes in Hamilton County; and

WHEREAS, this delayed response poses a significant threat to the lives of those who live and recreate in these counties; and

WHEREAS, states have long used special districts to enhance services for ever evolving communities; and

WHEREAS, Emergency Services Districts (ESDs), in particular, can reduce response times and increase the survival rate of patients who require prehospital care in areas that have been historically underserved; and

WHEREAS, according to the National Census Bureau, 150 ESDs were created to provide local fire protection and ambulance services between 2012 to 2017 in the United States; now be it

RESOLUTION CALLING ON NEW YORK STATE TO SUFFICIENTLY INVEST IN 9-1-1 FUNDING TO ENSURE PROPER MAINTENANCE WITH EXISTING SYSTEMS AND PREPARE FOR NEXT GENERATION 9-1-1 TECHNOLOGIES

WHEREAS, the funding mechanism that New York State counties use to help operate, maintain and upgrade 9-1-1 system capability and performance is out of date and does not correspond well to recent technology and marketplace changes; and

WHEREAS, the FCC has released their latest report for 2020 and its shows that New York collected \$241,643,008.00 and diverted over \$100,765,134.34 (41.7 percent) to other non 9-1-1 related purposes and the general fund; and

WHEREAS, currently it states in the Tax Law, Article 186-f, Section 5, forty-one and seven-tenths of the revenues collected and received are swept into the state general fund and not provided for public safety services; and

WHEREAS, this diversion shifts the bulk of Next Generation 9-1-1 (NG 9-1-1) readiness financing to counties and other local governments PSAPs in New York State; and

WHEREAS, the diversion of E9-1-1 funds results in a system that does not direct sufficient revenue to allow counties to properly maintain existing systems, while also preparing to implement NG 9-1-1 technology required under federal law; and

WHEREAS, under current law, for the last four budget years, \$10 million was authorized and targeted directly to PSAP's and up to \$65 million was set aside for the provision of grants and reimbursements to counties administered by the state interoperable communications grants (SICG) program, administered by the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, due to the designation of E9-1-1 fees for non 9-1-1 related expenses, New York State PSAPS are not eligible for any of the \$115 million federal grant funding for E9-1-1 and NG 9-1-1 enhancements and IP based advanced networks; and

WHEREAS, the goal of upgraded NG 9-1-1 systems is to make sure that all devices capable of connecting to the system can do so using voice, text, video images and other data formats to better inform the emergency responders to the situation they will be entering; and

WHEREAS, NG 9-1-1 upgraded systems will be able to better pinpoint an emergency call that may be in a remote area of the state or in a multi-storied building in one of our communities; and

WHEREAS, recognizing a more precise location of those needing emergency services will improve outcomes and save lives, but this cannot be accomplished without consistent and timely funding from the State; and now

BE IT RESOLVED, that the New York State Association of 5 Counties (NYSAC) calls on Governor Kathy Hochul and the Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services, Office of Interoperable Communications to release all funds authorized within the Enacted State Budget to ensure eligibility for federal FCC E9-1-1/NG9-1-1 resources, and to ensure monies collected for the Public Safety Surcharge are allocated within that budget year and remain in the Public Safety Surcharge fund and not moved into the general fund for nonpublic safety related purposes; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that NYSAC further calls on the State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (DHSES) to implement the draft 9-1-1 plan, and ensure the creation of a statewide NG 9-1-1 system connecting all of the county and municipal 9-1-1 systems into one statewide system; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, the NYSAC further calls on the State to fund NG 9-1-1 implementation with state resources; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, releasing these funding obligations on a regular schedule will provide certainty and build continuity as we upgrade and maintain existing systems and prepare for NG 9-1-1 development and implementation; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature shall forward copies of this resolution to Governor Kathy Hochul, Senator Robert Ortt, Assemblyman Steve Hawley, Assemblyman Michael Norris, NYSAC, counties of New York State encouraging member counties to enact similar resolutions and all others deemed necessary and proper.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF EFFORTS TO IMPROVE PROBATION AND ALTERNATIVES TO INCARCERATION IN NEW YORK STATE IN ORDER TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC AND REDUCE RELIANCE ON PRISONS, JAILS AND DETENTION

WHEREAS, county probation departments are an integral part of the Criminal Justice System and operate within the legal framework of the Criminal Procedure Law, the Penal Law and the Family Court Act; and

WHEREAS, it is the mission of probation to protect the community through intervention in the lives of those under supervision by facilitating compliance with court orders and serving as a catalyst for positive change; and

WHEREAS, state funding for probation was drastically reduced between 1990 and 2015 from a 46.5 percent State share in 1990 to less than 10 percent in 2022, putting a huge strain on counties and cost to county property taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, at the same time there have been increases in the number of mandated programs and services county probation departments are required to provide; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Council of Probation Administrators, representing New York State probation directors, administrators, and commissioners has diligently worked with the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) and State leaders to bring more awareness to the important work that Probation does to protect the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that NYSAC supports proposals put forward by the Governor to immediately enact statutory and regulatory changes that improve Probation and Alternatives to Incarceration in the following ways:

1. In response to raise the age legislation:

- A. Mandate that the state's evidence- based criteria should account for existing local best practice programs.
- B. Allow probation the ability to make an application for a temporary order of protection as a part of the adjustment process.
- C. Authorize law enforcement agencies to issue appearance tickets if deemed appropriate by the arresting officer, instead of physical arrest, when adolescent offenders and juvenile offenders are charged with most D felonies.
- D. Allow law enforcement agencies to deliver adolescent offenders and juvenile offenders to be held in detention facilities after hours without a securing order until the youth part is in session.
- 2. Establish a dedicated funding stream through DCJS/OPCA for 100 percent of all local probation costs including but not limited to probation personnel and evidence-based programming associated with raise the age legislation.

- 3. Eliminate the requirement of a sentence of a conditional discharge or probation for leandra law cases when a defendant has been sentenced to a definite jail term or a term of imprisonment.
- 4. That local probation departments receive 100 percent of all pre-trial services cost including but not limited to probation personnel associated with bail reform.
- 5. Eliminate the mandate that pre-sentence investigations must be conducted when a sentence of up to one year in jail has been negotiated.

RESOLUTION URGING THE GOVERNOR AND STATE LAWMAKERS TO GRANT DESIGN-BUILD CONSTRUCTION AUTHORITY TO COUNTIES AND NEW YORK CITY

WHEREAS, current road, bridge, building, and infrastructure construction projects are cumbersome and expensive for local governments and taxpayers in New York State; and

WHEREAS, design-build contracting saves time and money by eliminating time in procuring design services separately from construction services, and by making a single entity responsible for a project, reducing the possibility of contract claims related to design errors or omissions; and

WHEREAS, design-build is a method of construction project delivery in which one entity works under a single contract to provide design and construction services; and

WHEREAS, design-build projects minimize project risk for the owner, increase the accountability of contractors and streamlines the delivery schedule by compressing two procurements into one, eliminating one full procurement cycle; and

WHEREAS, design-build further streamlines the delivery schedule by overlapping the design and construction phases of a project; and

WHEREAS, the New York City Public Works Investment Act, authorizes some New York City agencies to use the design-build delivery method for certain capital projects over a specified dollar threshold amount; and

WHEREAS, New York State has granted design-build authority to itself and to New York City with great success the same authority should be granted to counties; and

WHEREAS, the State has proven this method saves both time and taxpayer spending all while minimizing project risk.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) hereby calls on the Governor and State Lawmakers to grant county governments the authority to use design-build construction to achieve these needed construction project results; and be it

RESOLUTION URGING THE ENACTMENT OF AN INCREASE IN THE STATUTORY CHIPS BIDDING THRESHOLD

WHEREAS, under current law, the local assistance funds allocated for local street or highway projects under the Consolidated Local Street and Highway Improvement Program (CHIPS) are used to undertake work on projects either with the municipality's own resources and work forces or by competitively bid contracts; and

WHEREAS, when the estimate for the contract work exceeds \$350,000 the work must be competitively bid in accordance with the provisions for competitive bidding in the General Municipal Law; and

WHEREAS, raising the competitive bidding threshold for highway projects is necessary to compensate for increases in inflation impacting material, transportation, labor, equipment and other highway construction costs; and

WHEREAS, Governor Kathy Hochul included an increase in the current cost threshold from \$350,000 to \$750,000 over which local highway and bridge construction work under the CHIPS program must be competitively bid in the 2022-2023 Executive Budget; and

WHEREAS, the Governor justifies the need for the increase in the minimum competitive bid threshold to mitigate the inflationary impacts on materials, labor, equipment and other construction related costs and maintains that enactment of this increase is necessary to allow more flexibility for municipalities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) supports the adoption of budget language that increases the CHIPS bidding threshold to give municipalities flexibility and the option to bid out or perform in-house projects that cost less than \$750,000 to allow more opportunities for county governments to act to minimize the cost of its transportation projects on behalf of local taxpayers; and be it

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF ASSEMBLY BILL A9990 AND SENATE BILL S8999 TO ALLOW NEW YORK STATE-PRODUCED WHOLE AND 2% MILK BACK INTO SCHOOLS

WHEREAS, Federal regulations enacted under the Obama Administration were put in place about ten years ago prohibiting whole and 2% milk from being served in schools which was intended to lower childhood obesity and diabetes rates as it was thought that fat free and I% milk were inherently healthier; and

WHEREAS, since the implementation of this restriction, childhood obesity and diabetes rates have continued to rise and many have become concerned that the restriction could be exacerbating the problem; and

WHEREAS, countering the narrative that whole and 2% milk are unhealthy for children, recent studies have shown children who drink full-fat dairy products tend to be leaner than their peers and have a lower risk of becoming overweight; and

WHEREAS, other studies have found those who consume whole-fat dairy may have a lower risk for heart disease and Type 2 diabetes, lower blood pressure, an increased satiety without weight gain and better sleep; and

WHEREAS, the removal of these milk options has also had a negative effect on dairy farms throughout upstate New York where milk dumping is on the rise. Already facing numerous obstacles in maintaining their viability as a business in recent years, Daily Farms have long counted on revenue from milk sales to schools to keep their businesses operational; and

WHEREAS, the removal of whole and 2% milk from school cafeterias has had nothing but negative impacts on all involved, including children and farmers. Providing more dairy options to students will encourage students to get the nutrition their growing bodies need from milk and help farmers recoup revenue lost since the passage of this ill-conceived prohibition; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Orleans Legislature fully supports Assembly Bill A9990 and Senate Bill S8999 to allow New York State-produced whole and 2% milk back into schools and encourages the Governor and State Legislation to enact the same; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, hat the Clerk to the Legislature shall forward copies of this resolution to Governor Kathy Hochul, Senator Robert Ortt, Assemblyman Steve Hawley, Assemblyman Michael Norris, the New York State Association of Counties and all others deemed necessary and proper.

RESOLUTION CALLING ON THE GOVERNOR TO COMPLETE AFFORDABLE CARE ACT ENHANCED FEDERAL MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PERCENTAGE RECONCILIATIONS THAT ARE YEARS OVERDUE AND PROVIDE A FULL ACCOUNTING OF FUNDS OWED TO COUNTIES AND NEW YORK CITY AND A SCHEDULE FOR RELEASE OF THESE FEDERAL FUNDS

WHEREAS, the funding to support the Medicaid program is provided by a combination of federal, state and local resources; and

WHEREAS, the state requires the counties and New York City to contribute \$7.6 billion annually to pay for the federal and state defined and controlled program; and

WHEREAS, additionally, counties and New York City also voluntarily contribute about \$1 billion annually to draw down available federal funds to support publicly owned or supported nursing homes, clinics, and hospitals; and

WHEREAS, the local share the state requires counties and New York City to pay is the highest of any state in the country; and

WHEREAS, this large local funding share for Medicaid and other state programs is a major contributor to New York's high local tax burden compared to other states; and

WHEREAS, under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) the federal government provided an enhanced Medicaid matching share (eFMAP), which has saved New York state billions of dollars; and

WHEREAS, the state is required under federal law to share these savings with counties and New York City based on the proportionate share localities pay of the nonfederal match; and

WHEREAS, the state has utilized a methodology that provides 80 percent of these estimated federal savings to counties in the year the costs accrue; and

WHEREAS, the balance of savings owed to counties is required to be reconciled annually to ensure the withheld savings are transferred to county budgets and local taxpayers, as well as meeting the intent of federal law; and

WHEREAS, for the first three years after enactment of the Affordable Care Act the state followed through on a relatively timely basis with the initial pass through of savings based on 80 percent of the estimated value of these federal savings to counties and New York City and when actual data became available after the close of the state fiscal year the final 20 percent was reconciled; and

WHEREAS, the last completed reconciliation and transfer of federal savings owed to counties was for state fiscal year 2015-16 with the reconciliation being implemented in December of 2020; and

WHEREAS, for each of these completed reconciliations of the final 20 percent of federal savings nearly all counties received additional federal savings based on the final data and caseload numbers; and

WHEREAS, as of February 8, 2022, counties and New York City are waiting on five years of final reconciliations for SFY's 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021; and

WHEREAS, individual counties and NYSAC have made numerous requests, over multiple years, regarding the status of outstanding Medicaid ACA eFMAP reconciliations and the federal funds withheld from counties; and

WHEREAS, due to the lack of a meaningful response from state officials, dozens of counties have submitted Freedom of Information Law (FOIL) requests to the New York State Department of Health (DOH); and

WHEREAS, as of February 8, 2022, 34 counties have received responses from DOH to their FOIL inquiries and that these calculations show that up to \$232 million could be owed to these counties, and when these 34 responses are extrapolated statewide for all counties and New York City that over \$1.7 billion in federal funding could be owed to counties and New York City for SFY's 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020; and

WHEREAS, because the state is withholding these federal funds it requires counties and New York City to reserve funds locally to make up for the loss, meaning local taxes have been kept higher than they need to be over multiple years, or local services are scaled back or eliminated; and

WHEREAS, in the years leading up to the last completed ACA eFMAP reconciliation, counties were provided an estimate of their coming year Medicaid costs by September, in time to incorporate the savings in their budgets, which ceased when regular reconciliations ended;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) urges the Governor to complete these unfinished reconciliations as soon as possible and to provide counties and New York City a full accounting of the federal funds owed, and to take immediate steps to release the funds to localities; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the state should also renew its practice of providing timely notice to counties of coming year Medicaid costs so they can appropriately budget those savings for local taxpayers and to preserve highly desired local quality of life services provided in our communities; and be it

WHEREAS, under state law, funding for New York's community colleges is to be provided through a combination of state aid, a county sponsor contribution, and student tuition and fees; and

WHEREAS, the establishment and continued operation of a statewide community college system was based on a commitment to ongoing State aid funding of at least one-third of community college operating costs; and

WHEREAS, Section 6305 of the State education law requires the state to reimburse counties for Fashion Institute of Technology chargebacks, but the state has not provided the necessary appropriations to comply with this state law requirement; and

WHEREAS, counties are currently being charged back for students attending FIT for Bachelors and Master's degrees, which was not the intent of state law and the community college chargeback funding requirement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) calls on the Governor and State Legislature to restore the full funding of FIT chargebacks to counties for this year and in future years related to all educational instruction provided after two years (coursework necessary for a 4-year, and/or master's degree); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature shall forward copies of this resolution to Governor Kathy Hochul, Senator Robert Ortt, Assemblyman Steve Hawley, Assemblyman Michael Norris, NYSAC, counties of New York State encouraging member counties to enact similar resolutions and all others deemed necessary and proper.

WHEREAS, for years, access to high-quality childcare has been limited to those who can afford it or are fortunate enough to receive a subsidy and be able to locate quality care, limiting the ability of parents of young children to enter and succeed in the workforce and for employers to find and retain skilled workers; and

WHEREAS, the average cost of childcare for an infant in New York State is \$15,394 per year, which is more expensive than in all but five states in the country; and

WHEREAS, childcare in New York State costs more than college, and infant care is more expensive than the average rent; and

WHEREAS, the lack of affordable and accessible childcare during the pandemic has driven women, in particular, out of the workforce in large numbers and led many to weigh whether staying out of the workforce is more cost-efficient; and

WHEREAS, New York State's Child Care Availability Task Force, which was cochaired by then-Lieutenant Governor Kathy Hochul, recognized that childcare is not just a women's issue but a societal and economic issue that touches every family, in every community, regardless of neighborhood or economic status; and

WHEREAS, according to a statewide poll conducted in the fall of 2020, the majority of New York State business leaders say the lack of accessibility and availability of high-quality childcare for infants and toddlers negatively impacts their businesses and their ability to hire and retain employees; and

WHEREAS, New York employers specifically cite employee absenteeism and callingout due to a lack of access to and availability of childcare for infants and toddlers, as well as reduced employee productivity and turnover due to child care issues, as contributing to loss in revenue; and

WHEREAS, on average, working parents in America miss five to nine days of work per year because of childcare problems, costing U.S. businesses \$3 billion a year in lost productivity; and

WHEREAS, Governor Hochul, in one of her first addresses to the business community as Governor, identified childcare as one of her top three priorities to support the economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, Office of Children & Family Services (OCFS) Commissioner Sheila Poole, in a September 2021 interview, called childcare "the superhighway to economic recovery"; and

WHEREAS, the significant difference between the childcare subsidy rate set by OCFS and the actual cost of providing care has contributed to extremely low wages for childcare workers, 98 percent of whom are women and 60 percent of whom are minorities; and

WHEREAS, low wages have led to a shortage of childcare workers, which has meant that childcare providers cannot keep up with demand and have fewer childcare slots to offer; and

WHEREAS, 64 percent of New Yorkers live in communities that qualify as child care deserts, meaning the community lacks sufficient child care for the vast majority of families that need it; and

WHEREAS, the size of the gap between subsidy rates and the true cost of quality varies by region but exists across the state for infants and toddlers; and

WHEREAS, the Child Care Availability Task Force's final report called on New York State to adopt subsidy rates that are aligned with the true cost of quality care, including recognizing the higher cost of care necessary for infants and toddlers; and

WHEREAS, high-quality childcare promotes healthy child development, which has longterm benefits for children and families, the economy, and society as a whole, as it is proven to reduce rates of incarceration, homelessness, and poverty in later life; and

WHEREAS, children who have quality early learning experiences are less likely to drop out of high school, need public assistance, or become a teen parent and are more likely to go to college and have good health as an adult; and

WHEREAS, quality early care and learning also helps reduce the disparities that are often associated with race, ethnicity, language, citizenship status, and socio-economic level; and

WHEREAS, investing in quality childcare is a critical public investment into a better functioning, more equitable, democratic economy and society;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) supports increasing the subsidy rate in the FY 2023 State Budget so it more closely aligns with the actual cost of care; and

WHEREAS, over the last 15 years the state has devolved away from their historic and constitutional responsibilities of providing social services and support for low-income families and individuals, as demonstrated through significant reductions in state financial support for these programs, thereby shifting state costs and responsibilities to counties and New York City; and

WHEREAS, these state funding shifts have increased county and New York City social services costs by hundreds of millions of dollars annually because the state requires that all services still be provided in full, sometimes including new and more comprehensive service levels, but with less state resources; and

WHEREAS, these cuts include a reduction of state fiscal match from 65 percent to 62 percent for child welfare services, and lowering state fiscal matching funds for Safety Net Programs from 50 percent to 29 percent along with maximizing federal funding to offset some of this loss, but the federal funds no longer offset losses for most counties today; and

WHEREAS, state funding support for the Foster Care Block Grant was cut by \$62 million in state fiscal year 2018, a 14 percent reduction; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's state fiscal year 2023 budget proposal would eliminate the 45-day waiting period for cash assistance under the Safety Net Program which will increase county and New York City costs by \$40 million annually; and

WHEREAS, the SFY 2023 budget proposal includes provisions to settle long standing state litigation related to inadequate foster care rates paid to foster parents; and

WHEREAS, in another recent state negotiated settlement to end litigation the Hurrell-Harring agreement provided 100 percent state funding support for all new costs of the settlement; and

WHEREAS, counties and New York City were not part of the foster care payment adequacy lawsuit or the settlement and it was the New York State Office for Children and Family Services that agreed to its terms, including significant increases in expenditures, without providing a corresponding increase in state funds to support the settlement and the Foster Care Block Grant;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the State should provide 100 percent of the necessary funding to cover the settlement they negotiated with The Adoptive and Foster Family Coalition of New York, estimated at \$200 million by county officials (\$117 million for New York City and \$83 million for the remaining counties) for the cost of reaching the Maximum State Aid Rate, plus annual rate increases, along with additional funds to cover the new Extraordinary rate category, which has been publicized as a 46 percent increase to New York City with other increases statewide; and

WHEREAS, homelessness and housing affordability continue to be major concerns across the state; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has made the situation worse by increasing rental rates and decreasing housing supply, while state policy is increasing the reliance on temporary housing assistance in shelters and motels; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Rental Assistance Program funding provided by Congress to prevent people from losing their homes and increasing homelessness was an essential strategy as the human hardships would have been far more devastating if we had not kept people housed; and

WHEREAS, the homeless population is facing new problems as the needs of families have become more complicated; and

WHEREAS, regardless of family size and demographics, many of those facing homelessness or seeking emergency shelter can have challenging medical needs, mental health and substance abuse issues, some are registered sex offenders, and still others are state prison parolees or on probation; with some facing several of these challenges at the same time; and

WHEREAS, the state is contemplating new hotel regulations that could reduce the number of units available to homeless families, leaving county officials with very limited options that may be less effective and more expensive in managing local homeless populations; and

WHEREAS, the state requires counties to fund 71 percent of costs for Safety Net individuals and 100 percent of the costs of administering these programs; and

WHEREAS, local social service districts focus scarce resources on achieving permanent housing, preventing homelessness and providing temporary placement; and

WHEREAS, counties maintain that while it is important to provide help in a crisis, it is better policy to maintain stability and prevent emergencies by providing sufficient resources up front;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) calls on the Governor and state legislature to prioritize permanency in housing and to update rental allowances and the standard of need which have not been properly adjusted in decades to fully address the dramatic growth in housing, energy and food costs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, as part of this reform effort the state must restore the Safety Net state match to 50 percent; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, as most counties rely on hotels and motels to shelter homeless individuals and families, the state should pare back or end highly burdensome hotel and motel regulations that end up limiting the supply of rooms available to counties that have little choice but to rely on this method of temporary housing; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the State should coordinate a timely transition to supportive housing for the highest need individuals with mental health and substance abuse issues in collaboration with OTDA, other state agencies, and local social services districts; especially those that have been repeatedly homeless and in need of supportive placements overseen by OMH, OASAS, OPWDD and DOCCS; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the state should target funding to counties that allow them to work with community partners to develop service models that achieve permanency through innovative and flexible approaches that meet local needs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the State should work with counties in developing a public education campaign to ensure people better understand the plight of families and individuals struggling with homelessness and how everyone can benefit by helping them achieve stable housing in our communities; and be it



Agreement between the County of Dutchess and the Cities of Poughkeepsie and Beacon in relation to the allocation of moneys collected from the sales and compensating use taxes imposed pursuant to Articles 28 and 29 of the Tax Law

WHEREAS, subdivision (c) of section 1262 of the Tax Law provides that sales and compensating use taxes (hereinafter "sales tax") imposed by a county and not set aside for county purposes or educational purposes shall be allocated quarterly to the cities and the area in the county outside the cities in proportion to their respective populations, or in such other proportion as may be agreed upon by the elective governing body of the county and of each of the cities in the county with the approval of the State Comptroller; and

WHEREAS, effective April 3, 2020, chapter 58 of the Laws of 2020 extended the authorization for the County of Dutchess (hereinafter "County") to impose the County sales tax at a rate which is three-quarters of one percent additional to the three percent authorized for the County, for the period beginning March 1, 2003 and ending November 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Cities of Beacon and Poughkeepsie (hereinafter "Cities") previously entered into an agreement (hereinafter "Agreement"), dated June 14, 2013, providing for the allocation of the County sales tax imposed for the period commencing March 1, 2013 and ending February 28, 2023, which agreement was approved by the State Comptroller on June 24, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Cities have entered into an agreement (hereinafter

"Amended Agreement"), dated March 7, 2022, to amend the Agreement with respect to the allocation of the County sales tax to the City of Poughkeepsie; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature, by Resolution No. 2022072, adopted on April 11, 2022, authorized the County Executive to execute the Amended Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Beacon, by Resolution No. 41 of 2022, adopted on February 22, 2022, authorized the Mayor of the City and the City Administrator to execute the Amended Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Poughkeepsie, by Resolution No. R-22-26, adopted on March 21, 2022, authorized the Mayor of the City and the City Commissioner of Finance to execute the Amended Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the undersigned has duly examined the Amended Agreement and has made inquiry into the facts in relation thereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to such examination and inquiry the undersigned does hereby FIND and DETERMINE that:

- 1. The Agreement, as amended by the Amended Agreement, provides that, in 2022, the County shall allocate an additional \$3,000,000 of the County sales tax to the City of Poughkeepsie.
- 2. Except as provided in paragraph one above, the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, THOMAS P. DiNAPOLI, Comptroller of the State of New York,

do hereby approve the allocation, between the Cities of Beacon and Poughkeepsie and the area of the County of Dutchess outside such Cities, of the sales tax imposed by the County and not set aside for county purposes or educational purposes, as provided for in the above-described Agreement and Amended Agreement. Any amendment or modification of the Agreement or Amended Agreement affecting such allocation, or any renewal or extension of the Agreement or Amended Agreement, shall be subject to the approval of the State Comptroller.

This approval relates only to such allocation between the Cities of Beacon and Poughkeepsie and the area of the County of Dutchess outside the Cities of Beacon and Poughkeepsie of the sales tax imposed by the County and not set aside for county purposes or educational purposes as provided for in the Agreement and Amended Agreement. This approval does not constitute an approval or opinion, as to either the legality or effect, of any other matter.

Legislators GARITO, PULVER, TRUITT, HOUSTON, CAVACCINI, POLASEK, KEITH, GELLER, SAGLIANO, CASWELL, and HAUSER offer the following and move its adoption:

WHEREAS, General Municipal Law Section 119-o authorizes municipal corporations to enter into agreements for the performance among themselves or one for the other in their respective functions, powers and duties on an individual, cooperative, joint or contract basis, and

WHEREAS, General Municipal Law Section 119-n defines "municipal corporation" as a county outside the City of New York, a town, a village, a board of cooperative educational services, fire district, or a school district, and defines a "municipal district" as a county or town improvement district, among other things, and

WHEREAS, Dutchess County entered into a Shared Services Agreement with the County of Rensselaer on or about October 8, 2021, for the term of October 4, 2021 through November 8, 2021, for Dutchess County to provide medical examiner services to Rensselaer County, and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned Agreement between Dutchess and Rensselaer Counties was negotiated to be extended on a monthly basis not exceeding six (6) months, and

WHEREAS, as the Agreement between the said Counties shall expire on May 9, 2022, and Rensselaer County wishes to continue receiving medical examiner services from Dutchess County, a new Agreement is now required, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Legislature to approve the annexed Shared Services Intermunicipal Agreement and to authorize the County Executive or his designee to execute the agreement, and WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend the 2022 Adopted County Budget to provide the funds for costs associated with this Intermunicipal Agreement, including, but not limited to laboratory fees, overtime for eligible employees, and additional compensation for employees for the duration of the said Agreement, now, therefore, be it

SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT

On Temporary Emergency Basis

THIS AGREEMENT, bearing the date set forth on the signature page, by and between the COUNTY OF DUTCHESS, a municipal corporation with offices at 22 Market Street, Poughkeepsie, New York 12601 (hereinafter referred to as the "DUTCHESS") and the COUNTY OF RENSSELAER, a municipal corporation, with offices at 1600 Seventh Avenue, Troy, New York 12180 (hereinafter referred to as "RENSSELAER").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, New York County Law Section 672 provides that counties are authorized to enter into written agreements for the provision of services provided by the county office of the medical examiner, and

WHEREAS, New York General Municipal Law Section 119-o provides that in addition to any other general or special powers vested in municipal corporations, municipal corporations shall have power to enter into, amend, cancel and terminate agreements for the performance among themselves or one for the other of their respective functions, powers and duties on a cooperative or contract basis, and

WHEREAS, the County of Rensselaer has requested assistance in performing the function of the Medical Examiner's Office for a limited duration to meet their legal obligation to provide such services, and

WHEREAS, the County of Dutchess is qualified and willing and able to provide services from the County of Dutchess' Medical Examiner office, now, therefore, it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1. <u>SCOPE OF SERVICES</u>. DUTCHESS agrees to supply medical examiner services to RENSSELAER using reasonable standards of care and in strict compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and procedures, as set forth in **Exhibit "A"** annexed hereto and made a part of this Agreement.

If any term of the Scope of Services contradicts or creates an ambiguity with any term of this Agreement, this Agreement shall govern.

- 2. <u>TERM OF AGREEMENT</u>. This Agreement shall be effective <u>May 10, 2022 and shall terminate on August 7, 2022</u>, unless otherwise terminated as set forth herein. This term is contingent on approval at the June 2022 Dutchess County Legislative Board Meeting.
- 3. <u>PAYMENT</u>. For the calendar year 2022, DUTCHESS shall charge RENSSELAER for medical examiner services per the fee structure included in **Exhibit "B"** attached hereto and made a part hereof.

At the end of each month, DUTCHESS will submit a bill for all medical examiner services supplied to RENSSELAER under this Agreement and RENSSELAER agrees to remit payment for said medical examiner services no later than the 15th day of the following month.

4. <u>EXTENSION</u>. This contract may be extended for two additional periods of 90 days each, upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed between the parties.

5. <u>DEFENSE AND INDEMNIFICATION</u>.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES: For all matters arising out of the professional services, provided under this Agreement each parties agree to the fullest extent permitted by law, to indemnify and hold harmless the other party, its officers, and employees against damages, liabilities and costs, including reasonable attorney's fees, to the extent caused by its sole negligent acts or omissions, or by the negligent acts or omissions of third parties under the direction or control of such party, in the performance of professional services under this Agreement.

GENERAL LIABILITY: For all matters other than those arising out of the professional services (such other matters commonly referred to as "General Liability Claims"), each party agrees to the fullest extent permitted by law to defend, indemnify and hold the other party and its employees harmless from any and all such losses, claims, liens, demands and causes for action, including but not limited to, judgments, penalties, interest, court costs, and legal fees incurred by the other party on behalf of such party, or its employees, in connection with or arising directly or indirectly from such party's sole negligent acts or omissions. Such indemnifying party shall investigate, handle, respond to and defend any such claims, demands or suits at its sole expense, and shall bear all other related costs and expenses even if such claims, demands or suits are groundless, false or fraudulent. This indemnification section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

In any matter in which indemnification hereunder for either professional or non-professional services would violate Section 5-322.1 of the New York General Obligations Law or any other applicable legal prohibition, the foregoing provisions shall not be construed to indemnify either party for damage arising out of bodily injury to persons or to property caused by or resulting from the sole negligence of either party's employees. The term "employee" shall include all officers, advisory board members and/or volunteers serving either party.

6. <u>INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS</u>. At all times during the term of this Agreement, both parties and its sub-contractors, if any, shall maintain at its own cost the following insurance and shall provide proof thereof to the other party, in the form of a Certificate of Insurance, prior to commencing work under this Agreement:

Worker's Compensation Employer's Liability (statutory limits). In compliance with the Workers' Compensation Law of the State of New York, each contractor shall provide:

a. a certificate of insurance on an Acord form indicating proof of coverage for Worker's Compensation, Employer's Liability, **OR**

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- b. a New York State Workers Compensation Notice of Compliance (Form C-105, Form U-26.3, Form SI-12 or Form SI-105.2P).
- c. In the event that the party is exempt from providing coverage, it must provide a properly executed copy of the Certificate of Attestation of Exemption from NYS Workers' Compensation Board, Form CE-200.
- d. <u>A certificate of participation in a self-insurance program</u>. The department responsible for the implementation of the Agreement will obtain verification from the Director of Risk Management for those municipalities participating in the Dutchess County Self-Insured Plan.

Commercial General Liability Insurance coverage including blanket contractual coverage for the operation of the program under this Agreement with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. This insurance shall be written on an occurrence coverage form and include bodily injury and property damage liability. Each party must list the other party as additional insured. The additional insured endorsement for the Commercial General Liability insurance required above shall not contain any exclusion for bodily injury or property damage arising from completed operations.

Automobile Liability Insurance coverage for all owned, scheduled, hired, and non-owned vehicles with a combined single limit of liability of not less than \$1,000,000. This insurance shall include coverage for bodily injury and property damage. Each party must list the other party as additional insured.

Professional Liability, with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per claim; \$3,000,000 in the aggregate. In the event of expiration or termination of this Agreement, each party hereto shall either maintain the abovementioned insurance coverage for a period of not less than three (3) years, or shall provide an equivalent extended reporting endorsement (commonly known as a 'tail policy').

Excess/Umbrella Liability, if required, with limits not less than \$5,000,000 per occurrence with a \$5,000,000 aggregate. Each party must include the other party as additional insured.

The Acord form certificate of insurance must contain the following provisions:

- (A) Each party must list the other party as certificate holder and additional insured on the commercial general, umbrella/excess, and automobile liability policies. In addition, the commercial general liability policy must include the additional insured endorsement forms cg 2037 July 2004 edition and the cg 2010 April 2013 edition or their equivalent.
- (B) The commercial general and automobile policies are primary and noncontributory.
- (C) The commercial general liability, auto liability and workers compensation policies must contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of the other party.

- (D) The umbrella/excess policy is primary and noncontributory and must contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of the other party.
- (E) If the workers compensation Notice of Compliance is used instead of the Acord certificate of insurance, the Notice of Compliance must indicate that a waiver of subrogation in favor of the other party is provided.

All policies of insurance referred to above shall be underwritten by companies authorized to do business in the State of New York with an A.M. Best financial strength rating of A- or better. In the alternative, the policies of insurance referred to above may be underwritten by Non-Admitted companies with an A.M. Best financial strength rating of A+ or higher. In addition, every policy required above shall be primary and noncontributory. Any insurance carried by the County, its officers, or its employees shall be excess and noncontributory insurance to that provided by the other party. Each party and its sub-contractor(s), if any, shall be solely responsible for any deductible losses under each of the policies required above.

Prior to cancellation or material change in any policy, a thirty (30) day notice shall be given to the County Attorney at the address listed below:

Rensselaer County Attorney Rensselaer County Government Center 1600 Seventh Avenue Troy, New York 12180

On receipt of such notice, the recipient shall have the option to cancel this Agreement without further expense or liability, or to require the other party to replace the cancelled insurance policy, or rectify any material change in the policy, so that the insurance coverage required by this paragraph is maintained continuously throughout the term of this Agreement in form and substance acceptable to the other party. Failure of a party to take out or to maintain, or the taking out or the maintenance of any required insurance, shall not relieve such party from any liability under this Agreement nor shall the insurance requirements be construed to conflict with or to limit the obligations of such party concerning indemnification.

All losses of a party's property shall be adjusted with and made payable directly to such party.

- 7. <u>DECLARATION BY CONTRACTOR</u>. Both parties declares that they have complied with all federal, state and local laws regarding business permits, certificates and licenses that may be required to carry out the work to be performed under this Agreement.
- 8. <u>NON-DISCRIMINATION</u>. No services to be rendered pursuant to, or in connection with, this Agreement may be refused to any person because of age, race, color, creed, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, disability or marital status.

Each party shall take all affirmative steps necessary to ensure equal employment opportunities without discrimination because of age, race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, disability or marital status and to comply with all federal, state and local civil rights laws including, but not limited to, the Americans with Disabilities Act.

- 9. <u>RETENTION OF RECORDS</u>. Both parties agree to maintain and have available for audit such records as may be required by either County, New York State or United States governmental agencies. These records shall be available for inspection by properly identified personnel of the above governmental agencies upon reasonable notice, and shall be maintained for a minimum of ten (10) years after termination of this Agreement.
- 10. <u>NON-ASSIGNMENT</u>. This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without prior written consent of each other nor its right, title, or interest therein assigned, transferred, conveyed, sublet or disposed without the previous written consent of both parties. An assignment of this Agreement shall not relieve the assignor of its obligations hereunder. In the event of assignment, all the provisions hereof shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the respective successors and assignees to the same extent as if each such successor or assignee were named as a party to the Agreement.
- 11. <u>TERMINATION</u>. (a) Without cause. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon ten (10) days' prior written notice to the other party of its intent to terminate without cause.
- (b) With cause. Either party may terminate this Agreement effective immediately, with subsequent written notice to be given to the other party of termination with cause.

In the event of termination with or without cause, RENSSELAER shall pay to DUTCHESS all amounts due to the time of termination in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. Such termination shall not give rise to any cause of action against DUTCHESS for damages, loss of profits, expenses or other remuneration of any kind.

- December 31st of any given year. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, it is understood and agreed that this Agreement shall be deemed executory only to the extent of the funds, available to each party for their respective performance of the terms hereof and that, in the event that the County Legislature of a party fails to appropriate the necessary funds to effect payment hereunder, this Agreement shall automatically cease and terminate on the last day of the year in which funds have been appropriated for said Agreement and no liability on account thereof shall be incurred by such party beyond the funds available for the performance of the terms of this Agreement. It is further understood and agreed that neither this Agreement nor any representation by any public employee or officer creates any legal or moral obligation to request, appropriate or make available monies for the purpose of this Agreement.
- 13. <u>NOTICE</u>. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, notice required to be given pursuant to this Agreement shall be made in writing and addressed to the following or such other person as the parties may designate:

- 14. <u>NON-WAIVER</u>. Failure of either party to exercise any rights under this Agreement for a breach thereof shall not be deemed a waiver thereof or a waiver of any subsequent breach.
- 15. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held unenforceable, the rest of the Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect.
- 16. <u>CHOICE OF LAW, VENUE</u>. Any dispute arising directly or indirectly out of this Agreement shall be determined pursuant to the laws of the State of New York. The parties hereby choose the New York State Supreme Court, Dutchess County as the forum for any such dispute.
- 17. <u>NO ARBITRATION</u>. Disputes involving this contract, including the breach or alleged breach thereof, may not be submitted to binding arbitration but must instead be heard in accordance with the Paragraph above entitled "Choice of Law, Venue".
- 18. <u>SERVICE OF PROCESS</u>. In addition to the methods of service allowed by the New York State Civil Practice Law & Rules ("CPLR"), Contractor hereby consents to service of process on it by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested or by facsimile (fax) transmission. Service hereunder shall be complete when deposited in the United States mail, duly addressed and with proper postage or when the fax has connected. Contractor must promptly notify the County, in writing, of each and every change of address to which service of process can be made. Service by the County to the last known address shall be sufficient. Contractor will have thirty (30) calendar days after service is complete in which to respond.
- 19. <u>CAPTIONS</u>. The captions are inserted only as a matter of convenience and reference, and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of this Agreement nor in any way affect the terms hereof.
- 20. <u>COUNTERPARTS</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be an original and shall constitute the same Agreement.
- 21. <u>GENDER</u>. Words of the masculine or feminine gender in this Agreement, unless the meaning of the sentence indicates otherwise, shall be deemed to refer to either male or female persons.

- 22. <u>BINDING</u>. This Agreement shall be valid and binding once it has been approved by the Dutchess County Attorney's Office, executed by the County Executive and delivered to RENSSELAER at the address indicated in the introductory paragraph of this Agreement.
- 23. <u>AUDIT</u>. Each party shall maintain an accounting system that enables each party to readily identify assets, liabilities, revenues, expenses and disposition of such party's funds. Records should include, but not be limited to, those kept by the party, its employees, agents, assigns, and subcontractors.

All vouchers or invoices presented for payment to be made hereunder, and the books, records and accounts upon which the vouchers or invoices are based are subject to review by the responsible department and audit by each party's County Budget Director. Each party shall submit any and all documentation and justification in support of expenditures or fees under this Agreement as may be required by the other party.

The audits may include examination and review of the source and application of all funds from the county, state, or federal governments. This paragraph shall survive the termination of the Agreement.

- WITHOUT CAUSE. Upon termination of this Agreement, both parties shall: (1) cooperate with each other to develop a transition plan and assist in affecting an orderly transfer of services. (2) provide the other party with access to and a copy of, all books, records and other non-proprietary documents including, but not limited to digital records, relating to the performance of services under this Agreement that are required or requested. The obligations of this paragraph shall survive the termination of this Agreement whether the agreement is terminated for cause or terminated for convenience.
- 26. <u>CONFIDENTIALITY</u>. Both parties shall comply with applicable federal and state requirements for confidentiality of records and information and agrees not to allow examination of records non disclosures of information, except as required under the terms of this Agreement.
- 27. <u>REQUIRED PROVISIONS OF LAW</u>. Each and every provision of federal, state or local law, rule or regulation required by law to be inserted in this Agreement shall be deemed to have been inserted herein. If any such provision is not inserted, through mistake or otherwise, then upon the application of either party, this Agreement shall be physically amended to make such insertion.
- MEANS. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one agreement, and any of the parties hereto may execute this Agreement by signing any such counterpart. A facsimile or signature transmitted by electronic means applied hereto or to any other document shall have the same force and effect as a manually signed original. This provision contemplates giving legal force and effect to copies of

signatures. This provision does not contemplate the use of "electronic signatures" as regulated by New York State Technology Law Article 3, "Electronic Signatures and Records Act."

29. <u>ENTIRE AGREEMENT</u>. The terms of this Agreement, including its attachments and exhibits, represent the final intent of the parties. Any modification, rescission or waiver of the terms of this Agreement must be in writing and executed and acknowledged by the parties with the same formalities accorded this basic Agreement.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022096

RE: AMENDING THE 2022 ADOPTED COUNTY BUDGET AND AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF BEHAVIORAL AND COMMUNITY HEALTH TO ESTABLISH A MICROGRANT PROGRAM TO BENEFIT VETERAN'S SERVICES AGENCIES

Legislators GARITO, PULVER, TRUITT, HOUSTON, CAVACCINI, POLASEK, KEITH, GELLER, D'AQUANNI, CASWELL, and SAGLIANO offer the following and move its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of the Department of Behavioral and Community Health ("DBCH") recognizes the need to provide funding for the benefit of non-profit agencies and/or municipality agencies that provide programs for veterans, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the County to establish a microgram to benefit veterans organizations and veterans-oriented programs in the sum of \$150,000 for the fiscal year of 2022, and

WHERES, the aforementioned total sum shall be used to fund projects in a "not to exceed" amount of \$15,000 for each non-profit 501(c)(3) agency and/or municipality to benefit veterans, and

WHEREAS, the non-profit agency and/or municipality shall in the future complete an application to be submitted and then a microgrant may be awarded on a "rolling basis", and

WHEREAS, the Legislature authorizes DBCH to establish a microgrant program to provide a not to exceed sum of \$15,000 to each of such non-profit 501(c)(3) organizations, and/or municipalities that apply for the funding to make improvements or expand programs for the benefit of veterans, and

RESOLUTION REQUEST - COUNTY HIGHWAY ADA IMPROVEMENTS AT

VARIOUS COUNTY LOCATIONS

The Department of Public Works is requesting authorization of \$1.5M for planning, design and construction of ADA and Universal Accessibility improvements along various County highways as detailed below:

- \$0.45M for construction of sidewalks, curb ramps, and access improvements along Innis Avenue (County Route 75) in the Town of Poughkeepsie. The project extends from Arnold Rd to Jackman Drive-North. This funding is in addition to approximately \$746,000 remaining in Capital Account H0538, which was previously authorized in 2019. If funding is approved, construction will commence in Spring 2023 and be complete by November 2023.
- \$1.05M for design/planning and construction of sidewalks, curb ramps, and access improvements along South Maple Avenue and North Maple Avenue (County Route 62) in the Village of Millerton. The project extends from Fish Street to Highland Drive. If funding is approved, design will begin in Summer 2022, with construction occurring between Spring 2024 and Winter 2024.

Note: Estimates for individual projects are approximate based on current information. Some projects may actually come in lower or higher than estimated; however, the cost for all projects combined will be within the total \$1.5 million.

Purchase and renovation of 26 Oakley Street, Poughkeepsie for Dutchess County Emergency Housing Facility for Single Individuals Experiencing Homelessness

Project Description

Dutchess County is considering the purchase and renovation of 26 Oakley Street to house the County's primary emergency housing facility for single individuals experiencing homelessness. The facility will be fully accessible and will include approximately 120 beds, bathroom facilities, offices, meeting rooms and community spaces, food prep and dining space, and indoor and outdoor recreation spaces. Minor modifications will be needed to the building's interior to fit up the spaces for the new use and to create access between the first and second floors, likely via an exterior addition that will contain an elevator and interior staircase.

Background

Pre-COVID Shelter Operations

Prior to COVID the primary overnight shelter for single individuals experiencing homelessness, known as Webster House, was located at 28 Snow Terrace in the Town of Poughkeepsie on the grounds of the former Hudson Psychiatric Center. The shelter was operated by Hudson River Housing (HRH). Guests were shuttled each evening at 7:00 p.m. from the Family Partnership Center at 29 North Hamilton Street to Webster House. Each morning guests were returned to the City of Poughkeepsie via public transportation. The former shelter had a maximum of 60 beds, while on-site overflow beds and off-site beds in the City of Poughkeepsie provided the additional beds needed during Code Blue, which requires the County house homeless persons when the temperature is below 32 degrees.

The day shelter, known as Mel's Place, was located at the Family Partnership Center at 29 North Hamilton St., Poughkeepsie. It was operated by Mental Health America of Dutchess County and was in a 1,200 sq. foot space that provided a safe haven, showers, laundry, a mailing address, as well as referrals for housing, employment and services. This also served as the location for registration and transportation to the overnight shelter.

Both facilities had limited staffing and had no space for on-site services to take place within. Guests were provided basic case management and referrals to connect them with services elsewhere in the community.

Existing Shelter Operations

In April 2020, these shelters were relocated to the vacant temporary pods behind the Dutchess County Jail at 150 North Hamilton Street in the City of Poughkeepsie in response to the COVID pandemic, as neither facility had enough space to allow for the required social distancing.

The existing facility is composed of two buildings totaling almost 15,000 sq. ft. The overnight shelter, which continues to be known as Webster House and be operated by HRH, has a maximum capacity of 150 beds utilizing just over 11,000 sq. ft.

The day drop-in shelter, Mel's Place, continues to be operated by Mental Health America of Dutchess County and utilizes approximately 3,800 sq. ft.

The temporary pod structures were constructed at the Dutchess County Jail site to allow for relocation of the inmates, during the demolition of a portion of the existing jail to facilitate the construction of the new Dutchess County Justice and Transition Center (DCJTC). The daytime and overnight shelters were temporarily relocated here to accommodate COVID restrictions once the inmates were relocated. However, these temporary structures must be removed by the end of the summer of 2023 to allow for the installation of underground stormwater storage structures required by the DCJTC project.

At the existing facility the day shelter operates from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and the overnight shelter operates from 4:00 pm to 7:00 am. Overnight guests must be on-site and registered by 7:00 p.m. and are not allowed to leave and re-enter the shelter after 10 pm until 7:00 a.m. the following morning. Over 90% of guests arrive on foot. Parking for staff, guests and agency vehicles is provided in an adjacent lot on the jail property using approximately 15 parking spaces.

The co-location of the day and overnight shelters has demonstrated some positive aspects which the County would like to carry over to the new facility. There have also been challenges - most significant being the intrusion of homeless guests on to nearby residential properties. This is primarily because the pods were not designed for a population which enters and leaves the facility daily. Amongst other shortcomings, the existing facility lacks appropriate outdoor spaces for activities such as socializing, fresh air, and a designated smoking area, and a clear, welcoming, and secure entryway. The lack of outdoor spaces, combined with the requirement that the Jail property be non-smoking, has pushed guests onto the public streets, some of whom have then wandered on to adjacent privately-owned properties. Appropriate outdoor spaces will be provided at the new facility and are more fully described below.

As with the former shelters, the existing facility has limited space for on-site services such as mental health counseling and employment services. Guests are provided basic case management and referrals to connect them with other services elsewhere in the community. Connecting to off-site referrals can be challenging for guests for a variety of reasons. This shortcoming will be addressed with the new facility.

It should also be noted that the shift from in-person to remote services throughout the community, while beneficial for some guests, was difficult to navigate or ineffective for others. It is generally agreed that the move back to in-person services as the pandemic recedes will be beneficial to many guests experiencing homelessness.

Existing Conditions at Project Site -26 Oakley St., Poughkeepsie

The building at 26 Oakley Street has been an office building since 1970 when it was moved to the site from the grounds of the 1969 World's Fair in Queens, NY. It is a 3-story, 24,640 sq. ft. building located on 1.4 acres in the City of Poughkeepsie (note: the third floor can only be used for storage). The site is 0.6-mile from the existing shelter via local streets. Aside from the building, the majority of the property is comprised of two asphalt parking lots with approximately 70 parking spaces total on the east and west sides of the building. There are small areas of grass around the parking lots and at the main entrance. The building has an accessible entrance and small outdoor space with some picnic tables.

Although the original building was part of the 1969 World's Fair in Queens, NY prior to being moved to the current site, the NY State Historic Preservation Office has confirmed that the property in question is not of historic significance and the proposed project will have no impact on any "...properties, including archeological and/or historic resources, listed in or eligible for the New York state and National Registers of Historic Places."

The building is located in the City of Poughkeepsie's Research and Development (R & D) District, and the proposed project is a permitted use as per §19-3.19.1(2)(a)(6) of the City's Zoning Code which allows "any other government uses or structures of the City of Poughkeepsie, County of Dutchess or the state or federal governments or agencies thereof." The building is adjacent to the Central Medium-Density Resident (R3-A) District which also permits the proposed use. The adjacent properties contain a manufacturing facility to the north, a food manufacturing facility to the south and east, and two multi-family apartment buildings and two vacant lots to the west.

For most of the building's existence it was occupied by the NYS Office of Mental Health (OMH), which operated a variety of mental health clinics related to the diagnosis and treatment of mental and behavioral disorders. During this time the main tenants were OMH and Dutchess County Department of Mental Hygiene (DCDMH). OMH operated workshops and employment programs for persons with mental health issues on the first floor, while DCDMH operated their Continuing Day Treatment Program on the second floor. The second floor of the building is currently occupied by ACCESS: Supports for Living which provides a variety of services including PROS which "combines treatment, support and rehabilitation to speed recovery and help people with mental illness or substance abuse participate fully in the community and in the workforce." The County intends to work with ACCESS to relocate their offices to an appropriate property. Guests at our existing homeless shelter have historically used a variety of the mental health, substance abuse and case management services provided on Oakley Street.

Proposed Project Details

The new shelter facility, like the existing one currently housed in the temporary structures on the DCJTC site, will include the overnight and day shelters at a single location. Unlike the existing facility, the new facility will provide space and staffing for a comprehensive menu of critical services. Some of these services are currently provided at the existing 26 Oakley Street facility, as discussed above.

The facility will be fully accessible and will include approximately 120 beds, bathroom facilities, offices, meeting rooms and community spaces, food prep and dining space, and indoor and outdoor recreation spaces. Minor modifications to the building will be needed to create access between the first and second floors, likely via an exterior addition that will contain an elevator and interior staircase.

Although it will be a 24/7 facility, guests wishing to sleep at the overnight shelter will need to be registered there by 7:00 p.m. and are not allowed to leave and re-enter the building until 7:00 a.m. the following morning. Guests who are employed may enter after hours with a note from their employer. This condition helps assure that the operations of the facility will not negatively affect the surrounding neighborhood during the nighttime.

Unlike the existing shelter which provides beds only in large dormitory spaces, the new shelter will provide beds in a combination of small dormitories and semi-private spaces (4-8 beds per room). Each space will have its own bathroom facilities. Guests will start in dormitory space and as they work towards independence, they will be able to graduate to more private rooms prior to leaving the facility for independent living. This advancement potential provides guests with further incentives to follow the rules and not be involved in any disruptive behaviors that may impact the community.

The proposed facility's inclusion of the day shelter allows for the provision of 3 meals per day. Office and meeting space will be provided for critical on-site services. In addition, the new facility will provide safe and comfortable outdoor spaces for socializing, and a separate outdoor area for on-site smoking. The goal is to provide spaces and services that meet guests' needs on-site and thus encourage them to remain there and not intrude on the adjacent properties. The outdoor spaces will be open during the day but secured after 7:00 p.m., again to prevent any negative impacts on the neighborhood at night.

We expect traffic to the new facility will be comparable to the past use. As with the prior on-site use, most of the staff will drive to the facility while many guests will walk. A few of the guests have cars and adequate parking is available on-site to accommodate them. Some guests have bicycles so secure bike storage will be provided. Public transit currently operates routes on Smith Street, which is accessible from the proposed site by sidewalk. The proposed facility's inclusion of the day and overnight shelter, provision of needed services and enclosed outdoor spaces for socializing and smoking will reduce any traffic impacts of the project.

The most significant difference between the services provided at the proposed facility versus those at the existing facility will be the availability of a wide range of critical services to help guests return to independent living. Our existing shelters provide minimal case management services, meaning guests must primarily go off-site to access critical services such as mental health and substance abuse services, employment services, medical care, legal services, and benefits. Accessing off-site services can be challenging for people who are struggling with activities of daily living. Bringing critical services on-site will improve access and help speed the transition to independence. The new facility will also partner closely with housing providers so we can move guests to independent living as quickly as possible. The County intends to issue a request for proposals for a single operator of the facility. The operator will likely provide some of the services themselves but will need to form partnerships with other agencies to bring additional critical services on-site. Critical services include but are not limited to:

- Intensive care management including licensed clinical supervision
- Independent living skills training
- Employment services
- Housing search assistance
- Assistance registering for benefits
- Financial literacy and asset building training
- Behavioral and mental health care
- Basic primary medical care

Basic primary medical care

Easy access to quality services is key to guests being able to successfully move to independence and stable housing. The proposed project is designed to incorporate the provision of these services on-site to increase the potential for single individuals experiencing homelessness to succeed, while ensuring the facility does not negatively impact the neighborhood.



Reasons supporting Negative Determination of Significance

The existing building at 26 Oakley Street will need only minor modifications to the building's interior and a small exterior addition to house an elevator and interior staircase to accommodate the proposed use, causing little change to the built environment of the area.

Although the original building was part of the 1969 World's Fair in Queens, NY prior to being moved to the current site, the NY State Historic Preservation Office has confirmed that the property in question is not of historic significance and the proposed project will have no impact on historic resources.

The proposed use is allowed in the City of Poughkeepsie's Research and Development District and the current use of the facility involves a variety of mental health, substance abuse, and case management services, which guests at our existing homeless shelter have historically used. The County's existing shelter at the Dutchess County Justice and Transition Center (DCJTC) site is less than 0.6 miles from the proposed site.

There is adequate space in the building to accommodate the overnight and daytime shelters and to provide critical services, which is a key to promoting the successful transition of clients to independent and stable housing. This also reduces the need for clients to travel or be transported to other facilities, decreasing any potential traffic impacts. Although it will be a 24/7 facility, clients wishing to sleep at the overnight shelter will need to be there by 7:00 p.m. and are not allowed to leave and re-enter the building until 7:00 a.m. the following morning. This condition reduces nighttime traffic and activity on the site, as well as the surrounding neighborhood, thereby decreasing the potential impact that the operations of the facility will have upon same. The new facility will provide safe and comfortable outdoor spaces for socializing and a separate outdoor area for on-site smoking, both of which will encourage clients to remain on-site rather than in the surrounding neighborhood, which might increase potential for negative interactions therein. In addition, the new facility will have a clear, welcoming, and secure entryway which does not presently exist at the DCJTC site, causing confusion and disruption at that site.

In determining the potential for the proposed project to significantly and negatively impact the character of the community at this location, the County has relied upon guidance provided by the NYSDEC in "The SEQR Handbook, Fourth Edition, 2020" and the "Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) Workbooks". As "Community Character" is an amorphous phrase meaning different things to different people, the following questions are provided by NYSDEC for guidance:

- Will the action eliminate historic resources?
- Will the action create demand for additional community services?
- Will the action displace affordable or low-income housing?
- Will the action interfere with enjoyment of designated public resources?

- Is the action inconsistent with the predominant architectural scale and character?
- Is the action inconsistent with the character of the existing natural landscape?
- Other impacts?

NYSDEC SEQR Handbook on page 84 provides the following additional guidance regarding the significance of an impact on community character:

29. How can a lead agency determine whether an impact upon community character may be significant?

...Courts have supported reliance upon a municipality's comprehensive plan and zoning as expressions of the community's desired future state or character...

Examples of actions found not to be significant include low-income housing and shelters for the homeless proposed to be located within existing residential areas.

As stated earlier in the review, (like most communities) the City of Poughkeepsie's comprehensive plan makes no mention of the homeless nor does it include a specific provision for a shelter in its zoning. The zoning does however provide a broad provision for government uses in this zone.

During the public comment periods at the Dutchess County Legislative Committee Meetings on April 7, and May 5, and the Legislative Board Meetings on April 11 and May 9, 2022, City of Poughkeepsie residents and others voiced concerns about impacts to community character. Most of the comments addressed the following community character questions:

- Will the action create demand for additional community services?

 Comments stated that the Community is already challenged by crime, drugs, and guns, and that there is a need for additional police resources, while others commented that additional police resources might result in additional conflict within the community.
- Will the action interfere with enjoyment of designated public resources?

 Several commenters expressed concerns about potential negative impacts on College Hill Park since its recent revitalization.

While Dutchess County is sensitive to the concerns voiced by City of Poughkeepsie residents and others at these hearings, and it understands the natural fears that neighbors and others have for facilities such as this, the SEQR Handbook specifically provides that the type of facility being considered at 26 Oakley Street falls into the category of examples of actions found NOT to be significant, even when located entirely within an existing residential area. This property is adjacent to a residential area on one side, and an industrial on the other. Additionally, past research and experience from around the country has shown that the potential negative impacts of affordable housing, supportive housing, and even shelters are generally overestimated by neighbors and others.

Thus, given the lack of potentially significant negative impacts to the environment from the project and the NYSDEC' guidance on consideration of Community Character issues, the County determines that the purchase and renovation of 26 Oakley Street, in the City of Poughkeepsie, for use as a Dutchess County Emergency Housing Facility for Single Individuals Experiencing Homelessness, will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts.

Notwithstanding this determination, the County recognizes the need for and importance of partnering with the City of Poughkeepsie and residents of the surrounding community to ensure not only the success of this project, but also to ensure that the surrounding community is not negatively impacted by its existence. Accordingly, the County plans to undertake the following initiatives in conjunction with the involved project:

- 1. The County, in conjunction with the City of Poughkeepsie, will work to enhance neighborhood security by developing a community safety unit. The proposed facility will be a safe site within the neighborhood, operated on a 24/7 basis.
- 2. The County will create a legislative committee, based on the Justice and Transition Center model, consisting of at least one (1) Legislator representing the City of Poughkeepsie to provide input regarding the 26 Oakley Street project.
- 3. The County will create a stakeholders' group to provide advice regarding operational aspects of the project. This stakeholders' group will include both residential and commercial neighbors, representatives for the homeless (including mental health and substance abuse organizations), and service providers. We believe this group will help to address the concerns expressed by some that "outsiders" do not understand what resources are needed by people of color living in the community.
- 4. The County will create a process whereby neighbors may provide direct feedback regarding the operation of the facility and address any ongoing concerns involving community relations.

The County intends to proceed with the purchase of 26 Oakley Street and plan for the minor renovations and small addition needed to accommodate the proposed facility within the existing building. Concurrently, the County will work with the City of Poughkeepsie, community residents, and potential service providers, through the initiatives cited above, to tailor the facility's operations and provide adequate resources to assist the facility's guests, while not negatively impacting the community. The programmatic refinements developed will be implemented through the following actions:

- Development of the scope for the Request for Proposals for a single Facility Operator and determination of programmatic resources required.
- Creation of a community safety unit at the new facility and any associated agreements needed between the County, City, and any involved non-profit organizations.
- Creation of communication channels between the facility operator, involved non-profit organizations, County, City, and residents to enable constructive community feedback on the ongoing operations of the facility, including the creation of a process for addressing any issues that arise related to the facility.

Legislators CAVACCINI, PULVER, and CASWELL offer the following and move its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Dutchess County Legislature has before it a Resolution authorizing allocation of County funds as they pertain to the purchase of an emergency housing shelter in Dutchess County, New York, for the purposes of utilizing the property and improvements at the site as an emergency housing facility for individuals experiencing homelessness and also to provide on-site services to assist these individuals in becoming self-sufficient, and

WHEREAS, Dutchess County desires to form a Committee to ensure meaningful community input into the development and ongoing operations of the proposed emergency housing facility for individuals experiencing homelessness in Dutchess County, to be known as the "Stakeholder Group", and

WHEREAS, such Stakeholder Group shall be comprised of up to eleven (11) members, who shall be appointed by the Chairman, the Majority Leader, or Minority Leader of the Legislature, respectively, as more fully set forth in the "Dutchess County Emergency Housing Facility Community Input Process Framework", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as if fully set forth herein, and

Re: Emergency Housing Facility Stakeholder Group

After eight months of attempts, the appointing authorities have not finalized appointments to the Emergency Housing Facility Stakeholder Group. One burden which has slowed the appointment process is the proximity requirements for six of the representatives.

I believe a good faith effort was made by all appointing authorities to populate this Group quickly so it may begin with its mission. An article *Dutchess creating stakeholders group for homeless shelter plan: Here's how it will work* published by the Poughkeepsie Journal on January 13, 2023 resulted in six members of the public contacting the County Legislature for consideration however only three lived within the necessary geographic proximity.

In response to a lack of a quorum, I have determined it is necessary to alter the proximity for representatives. Under the authority in the Committee's adopted framework, I am expanding the geographic proximity of this Committee for all three categories (community, faith-based, and business owner) to a limit of five miles. This is practical for a number of reasons. Chiefly, a permanent location of the facility has not been determined. Members of this Group should become experts over the next few years in the holistic approach to homelessness provided at the Facility. Homelessness is not uniquely a City of Poughkeepsie issue and qualified representatives from surrounding areas should be available to lend their expertise and passion. Finally, the structure of the Group means a majority of the Group's membership will always be close proximity community representatives.

Dutchess County Emergency Housing Facility Community Input Process Framework

Dutchess County is considering the purchase and renovation of an emergency housing shelter to house the County's primary emergency housing facility for single individuals experiencing homelessness. To properly address community feedback regarding the project, the Legislature created a working group to develop the following a community input process to ensure meaningful community input into the facility's development and ongoing operations.

Stakeholder Group

The Stakeholder Group will include a maximum of 11 members as follows:

- County Legislator representing the community where the proposed project site is located
- Councilperson representing the community where the proposed project site is located
- A representative from any school in the proximity of the facility recommended by the school district to the Chair of the Legislature
- A representative of the municipality where the proposed project site is located recommended by the municipality's Chief Elected Official to the Chair of the Legislature
- A person with lived experience with homelessness as recommended by the Facility Director or shelter staff to the Chair of the Legislature
- Up to 6 representatives (3 appointed by the Majority Leader and 3 by the Minority Leader) from the following categories:
 - A maximum of 3 neighbors who live near the facility as outlined in the "Proximity Chart" below (there is a preference for neighbors within ¼ mile)
 - A maximum of 2 business owners who operate businesses near the facility as outlined in the "Proximity Chart" below (there is a preference for one business that services shelter guests)
 - A representative from the faith-based community near the facility as outlined in the "Proximity Chart" below

No person employed by an agency that provides paid services at the facility may serve on the Stakeholder Group.

The Stakeholder Group will be staffed by Facility Director, and staff from the community safety unit will attend meetings as needed.

In the event of a future vacancy in the Stakeholder Group, the Chairman of the Legislature may modify the proximity chart in order to make an appointment to the vacancy if he deems it necessary, after taking into consideration the recommendation of the Stakeholder Group.

Request for Proposals (RFP) Process - Facility Operations

The County shall hold a public meeting to solicit input from the community on the RFP and Facility Director's Job Description. As appropriate, comments will be incorporated into these documents before the draft is provided to the Stakeholder Group for its review.

The draft RFP for a facility operator, including review criteria, will be provided to the Stakeholder Group for a 30-day review period. County staff will hold at least one review meeting with the Stakeholder Group during this period to discuss suggestions and changes. Suggestions may be submitted to County staff orally or in writing.

The final draft RFP will be provided to the Stakeholder Group for a 15-day review period. The document will be provided with changes highlighted to assist with the review. A second meeting will be held if necessary.

For both the draft and final RFP, suggestions will be incorporated as appropriate and those not incorporated will be discussed with the Stakeholder Group.

Final approval for the RFP will be made by the Office of Central and Information Services (Purchasing Division) in consultation with the Commissioner of the Department of Community and Family Services (DCFS).

County staff will conduct outreach in advance of the issuance of the RFP to facilitate community interest in replying to the RFP. The County will compile and maintain a list of prospective agencies who have replied to the RFP, which the County will share with the Stakeholder Group, as well as solicit additional agency suggestions from the Group.

The RFP shall be released for a minimum of eight (8) weeks to ensure sufficient time for potential respondents. The County will use standard procurement outreach (legal notices, bid-net, e-mail to prospective bidders, etc.) in coordination with the County's procurement policies and procedures. The Stakeholder Group may provide input into additional outreach mechanisms including but not limited to: social media and the Continuum of Care e-mail list. All outreach must be conducted in accordance with State and local procurement guidelines.

In the interest of assisting the County Executive in finding a Facility Operator, the Stakeholder Group will have the opportunity to review and rank RFP responses independently and provide its input and analysis to the County Executive. The Stakeholder Group will submit a prioritized list of the top 2-3 proposals to the County Executive for final review and selection, and the County Executive will take such information under advisement. Additionally, the Stakeholder Group may make recommendations to the County Executive as to who he may appoint to review the RFP for Facility Operator, including but not limited to: the Commissioner of the Department of Community & Family Services, the Deputy Commissioner of Housing at the Dept. of Planning and Development, an Assistant County Executive(s), and any non-elected representatives from the Stakeholder Group.

Emergency Shelter Director Selection Process

The draft job description, including qualifications, will be provided to the Stakeholder Group for a 30-day review period. County staff will hold at least one review meeting with the Stakeholder Group during this period to discuss suggestions and changes. Suggestions may be submitted orally or in writing. County staff will incorporate suggestions as appropriate into a final job description.

The final job description will be provided to the Stakeholder Group for a 15-day review period. The document will be provided with changes highlighted to assist with the review. A second meeting will be held if necessary.

For both the draft and final job description, suggestions will be incorporated as appropriate and those not incorporated will be discussed with the Stakeholder Group.

Final approval of the job description will be made by the Department of Human Resources in consultation with the Commissioner of the Department of Community and Family Services (DCFS).

County staff will work with the Stakeholder Group to create an outreach plan to identify potential applicants and make the community aware of the job opportunity. The County will create a list of potential applicants and will solicit additional suggestions from the Stakeholder Group. The County will conduct outreach as appropriate to specific individuals.

The job posting shall be released for a minimum of four (4) weeks to ensure sufficient time for potential applicants. Posting will be released in accordance with Department of Human Resources policies, procedures and methods, as well as social media and other avenues recommended by the Stakeholder Group and community.

In the interest of assisting the County Executive in finding the best candidate for Facility Director, the Stakeholder Group will have the opportunity to review resumes and submit a prioritized list of the top 2-3 candidates to the County Executive for final review and selection. Additionally, the Stakeholder Group may make recommendations to the County Executive as to who he may appoint to interview prospective candidates, including but not limited to: County Legislator from the proposed project site, Councilperson from the proposed project site, and any representative from the Stakeholder Group, as selected by the Stakeholder Group.

Ongoing Community Input

The Stakeholder Group shall work with County staff to develop a mechanism for:

- Neighbors to directly communicate with the Facility Director on immediate concerns so they can be addressed immediately via both short- and long-term solutions
- The wider community to convey concerns and suggestions on the facilities operations

The frequency of engagements will be determined, reviewed, and adjusted by the Stakeholder Group.

Options for communication include, but are not limited to:

- Quarterly meetings with neighbors and the wider community
- Regular informal gatherings with neighbors, such as picnics in local parks
- Direct contact information provided to neighbors, suggestion box and other methods identified by the Stakeholder Group

The Facility Director will track all complaints related to the facility and their resolution, and report this information to the Stakeholder Group.

Note: All procurement and hiring must be conducted following Federal, State, and local laws and regulations.

Wherefore: Gun violence is a uniquely American problem-and it's only getting worse. The Giffords Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence reports that within the last IO years, the firearm mortality rate has risen nearly 18%, with an average of 39,000 Americans dying from gun violence from 2015 to 2019. Over 45,000 Americans died from gun violence in 2020 alone. According to the Centers for Disease Control, an average of 483 deaths per year are from unintentional shootings. The average number of non-fatal injuries from a firearm doubles to 76,127 per year. A key driver of gun violence in the United States is the wide availability of firearms. When a gun is easily accessible, the risk of homicide, suicide, and unintentional shootings rises dramatically.

New York State serves as a national model for developing and investing in community violence prevention and intervention programs. In 2019, New York had the second-lowest gun death rate in the country and the seventh-lowest crime gun export rate. In addition, New York has taken bold action to save lives from gun violence and as recently passed legislation banning the possession or sale of ghost guns and allowing the gun industry to be neld liable for irresponsible behavior. However, according to statistics from the Giffords Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence: 54% of gun deaths in New York are suicides and more than 27% of all suicide deaths in New York involve firearms. From 2013 to 2017, 2,283 people in New York died by gun-related suicide--one every 19 hours. Guns make domestic violence incidents far more likely to end in death with nearly 37% of New York's intimate partner homicides involving a gun. From 2007 to 2016, 180 women were killed with a gun by their intimate partner in New York. Exposure to gun violence can cause lasting trauma in young people, leading to PTSD, chronic stress, and decreased future earnings. From 2013 to 2017, 910 people under age 25 were killed with a gun in New York and more than a third of New York's gun homicide victims are under the age of 25.

According to Everytown for Gun Safety, one of the largest gun violence prevention organizations in America, access to a firearm significantly increases the risk of death by suicide, domestic dispute, homicide, and unintentional gunshot. Gun owners and those contemplating buying guns should learn about the risks associated with guns. By requiring gun dealers to inform purchasers of the risks associated with firearms, buyers can make educated decisions about owning and storing guns and is a meaningful step towards preventing gun violence. Compelling firearms dealers to provide warnings about the risks associated with firearms is a means of promoting safety. Point of sale messaging has been a proven method of influence of a consumer's behavior in industries, such as tobacco and restaurants, where warning labels have influenced the consumer to make smarter, safer, and healthier choices.

This proposed legislation will require every person, firm or corporation located in the County of Dutchess and rngaged in the retail business of selling weapons to post a notice in the place where such weapons or firearms are displayed or delivered to the purchaser at the entrance to the site and in at least one additional area where sales occur conspicuously stating, in no smaller than 24-point type and on paper at least 8 and 1/2 inches by 11 inches in bold print the following warning:

ACCESS TO A WEAPON OR FIREARM IN THE HOME SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASES THE **RISK** OF SUICIDE, HOMICIDE, DEATH DURING DOMESTIC DISPUTES AND UNINTENTIONAL DEATHS TO CHILDREN, HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS AND OTHERS. IF YOU OR A LOVED ONE IS EXPERIENCING DISTRESS AND/OR DEPRESSION, CALL THE CRISIS PREVENTION AND RESPONSE TEAM AT (845) 485-9700 or THE NA TIONAL SUICIDE HOTLINE AT 988.

Upon the issuance of a license, the County Clerk would also be required to provide the licensee a written copy of the notice indicating the warning risks of the presence of a weapon or firearm in the home.

RE: LOCAL LAW NO. __ OF 2022, A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE OF THE COUNTY OF DUTCHESS, IN RELATION TO THE POSTING OF NOTICES WARNING OF THE DANGERS OF WEAPONS OR FIREARMS

BE IT ENACTED by the County of Dutchess as follows:

Section 1. The administrative code of the County of Dutchess is amended by adding a new chapter to read as follows:

Purpose.

The purpose of this Chapter to provide for and promote the health, safety, and welfare of the general public by specifically informing potential buyers of weapons or firearms in Dutchess County of the dangers of owning a firearm in the home. Ownership of a weapon or firearm in the home can lead to accidental discharge, preventable suicide, unintended death of a child or other household members or death during a domestic dispute. Requiring weapon and firearm dealers to post a warning notice delineating the risks of weapons or firearms use will provide important information to the customer who can then make smarter and safer buying choices.

Definitions. For the purposes of this, the following terms have the following meanings:

- a. Dealer. Any person, firm, partnership, corporation or company who engages in the business of purchasing, selling, keeping for sale, loaning, leasing, or in any manner disposing of including but not limited to: any rifle, shotgun, firearm, machine gun or assault weapon including a semiautomatic rifle, shotgun, firearm, as those terms are defined in Section 265.00 of the New York State Penal Law;
- o. Firearm. As stated in New York State Penal Law Section 265, (a) Any pistol or revolver; or (b) a shotgun having one or more barrels less than eighteen inches in length; or (c) a rifle having one or more barrels less than sixteen inches in length; or (d) any weapon made from a shotgun or rifle whether by alteration, modification, or otherwise if such weapon as altered, modified, or otherwise has an overall length of less than twenty-six inches; or (e) an assault weapon. For the purpose of this subdivision the length of the barrel on a shotgun or rifle shall be determined by measuring the distance between the muzzle and the face of the bolt, breech, or breech lock when closed and when the shotgun or rifle is cocked; the overall length of a weapon made from a shotgun or rifle is the distance between the extreme ends of the weapon measured along a line parallel to the center line of the bore. Firearm does not include an antique firearm;
- c. Weapon. Any rifle, shotgun, firearm, machine gun or assault weapon including a semiautomatic rifle, shotgun, firearm, as those terms are defined in Section 265.00 of the New York State Penal Law;
- d. Site. The facility where a sale and transfer of weapons or firearms is conducted.

Disclosure Notice.

a. Every Dealer located in the County of Dutchess and engaged in the retail business of selling weapons shall not sell, deliver, transfer or otherwise dispose of any weapon to another person unless a notice is posted in the Site where such weapons or firearms are displayed or delivered to the purchaser at the entrance to the site and in at least one additional area where sales occur conspicuously stating, in no smaller than 24-point type and on aper at least 8 and 1/2 inches by 11 inches in bold print the following warning:

WARNING

ACCESS TO A WEAPON OR FIREARM IN THE HOME SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASES THE RISK OF JUICIDE, HOMICIDE, DEATH DURING DOMESTIC DISPUTES, AND UNINTENTIONAL DEATHS TO CHILDREN, HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS AND OTHERS. IF YOU OR A LOVED ONE IS EXPERIENCING DISTRESS AND/OR DEPRESSION, CALL THE MOBILE CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM AT (845) 485-9700 or THE NATIONAL SUICIDE HOTLINE AT 988.

b. Upon the issuance of a license, the County Clerk shall provide the licensee a written copy of a warning notice conspicuously stating in no smaller than 24-point type and on paper at least 8 and 1/2 inches by 11 inches in bold print the following warning:

WARNING

ACCESS TO A WEAPON OR FIREARM IN THE HOME SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASES THE RISK OF SUICIDE, HOMICIDE, DEATH DURING DOMESTIC DISPUTES, AND UNINTENTIONAL DEATHS TO CHILDREN, HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS AND OTHERS. IF YOU OR A LOVED ONE IS EXPERIENCING DISTRESS AND/OR DEPRESSION, CALL THE CRISIS PREVENTION AND RESPONSE TEAM AT (845) 485-9700 or THE NATIONAL SUICIDE HOTLINE AT 988.

c. The County of Dutchess and its agencies, officers or employees shall not be liable to any party by reason of any injury or damage resulting from the failure of any person subject to this Chapter, to comply with this Chapter, or by reason or in consequence of any act or omission in connection with the implementation or enforcement of this Chapter.

'iolations.

- 1. For the first and second violation of this Chapter, the person shall be guilty of a violation punishable by a fine of not more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for each violation.
- 2. For subsequent violations of this Chapter, the person shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) for each violation.

Severability.

If any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this Chapter shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its

operation to the words, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

§2. This Local Law shall be effective ninety (90) days after its adoption.

Gun Violence in the United States


OVERVIEW

In an average year, 40,620 people die and 84,776 are wounded by guns in the United States, costing the country \$280 billion each year.

GUN DEATHS OVER TIME

In the United States, the rate of gun deaths have increased 33% from 2011 to 2020. During that same time period, the rate of gun suicides increased 12% and gun homicides increased 70%.





COST OF GUN VIOLENCE

Gun deaths and injuries cost the United States \$280 billion, of which \$13 billion is paid by taxpayers. The average cost for overall gun violence in the United States is \$860 for every person.

GUN DEATHS BY INTENT

In the United States, 59% of gun deaths are suicides and 38% are homicides. Mississippi has the highest rate of gun deaths in the country, Wyoming has the highest rate of gun suicides, and DC has the highest rate of gun homicides.



GUN SUICIDES AND SUICIDE ATTEMPTS



GUN HOMICIDES AND ASSAULTS

Every year, an average of 15,889 people in the United States die by gun homicides and 36,726 are wounded by gun assaults—a rate of 5.1 homicides and 11.2 assaults per 100,000 people. Of all homicides in the United States, 76% involve a gun. In the United States, Black people are 10 times more likely than white people to die by gun homicide.
