March Monthly Report	The Commissioner's Monthly Reports for March was distributed prior to today's meeting.	
	Jean-Marie shared information on the new Children's Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) Team that's launching. It'll be run by	
	Astor. This model provides community-based mental health treatment to youth who struggle with traditional service models. Hiring efforts for	
	staff are underway, although they've faced some challenges in recruitment.	
	There will also be a Forensic ACT team coming online, run by RSS. This will be serve people who are coming out of incarceration.	
	There was discussion about the Safe Option Support (SOS) Team, which is a team of outreach workers that find housing for individuals who may have been homeless for a very long time and struggling with mental health issues. OMH recently awarded them beds, but they're regional across the area. Sarah shared that they've had a sporadic presence in the northwest part of the county but because they're stretched so thin and covering such a large area, it's hard for them to establish trust with the community with a more regular presence. Jean-Marie is hopeful that their effectiveness will result in an expansion of their services.
