Starting fall 2020, the Arlington Food Service Department will be making school lunch and breakfast available to students. Bagged “meal kits” including both lunch and breakfast will be available for all students. These meal kits are free for any student who is eligible for Free or Reduced Meals. For all other students, the cost to purchase the meal kit (which includes lunch and breakfast) is as follows: Elementary, \$4.70; Middle School, \$4.85; and High School, \$5.00. Families can pick up meal kits at the entrance of every Arlington school from 10:30am until 2:00pm. In order to receive these meals, either a student or their parent/guardian must provide the student’s name, student ID number, and the school they attend for each meal kit. Please note that only one kit per student can be provided.

The summer food service program has been extended until December 31, 2020 or until the funds run out. As a result, all HPCSD students 18 years of age and under are eligible for free meals. Distribution for the month of September is as follows:

- Location: District Office, 11 Boice Road (across from Regina Coeli Church on Route 9)

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- Dates: September 10th, 14th, 21st, and 29th
- Times: 11am to 1pm and 4:30pm to 5:30pm

Breakfast and Lunch meals for the whole week will be provided at pickup. Parents or guardians are permitted to pick up for their children only; they may not pick for other families. Please note that a face mask must be worn in order to receive meals. To help limit interaction and to adhere to department of health recommendations, families will be required to get out of the car to pick up their meals. Meals will be placed on a table 6 feet away from staff.

If you are unable to pick up during these distribution times, please contact the food service department ((845) 229-4006 or foodservices@hpcsd.org) before Friday at 4pm to make alternate accommodations.

Meals will be provided to all children without charge and are the same for all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability, and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service. In accordance with Federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its Agencies, offices, and employees, and institutions participating in or administering USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age, or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity in any program or activity conducted or funded by USDA. At any point during the 2020-2021 school year -- if a remote learning model is utilized or for students who are engaging remotely at any point during the school year -- all students who wish to partake in either the breakfast and/or lunch programs will be provided the opportunity to obtain meals. Breakfast and lunch meals will be provided on Mondays and Thursdays. Prepackaged meals that meet USDA requirements will be available for pickup at Bulkeley Middle School at 8:30am to 10:30am. On Mondays, 3 breakfasts and 3 lunches are provided and on Thursdays, 2 breakfasts and 2 lunches are provided. These schedules will be modified as schedule models change and in the event the district, or student, moves from in-person hybrid models to remote, etc. When picking up meals, the name of the student must be provided so that the student's account can be checked for allergies to ensure that none of the items in the packages could cause a known allergic reaction.

For students participating in in-person learning, grab & go meals will be available to take home.

For students at Hagan & Nassau Elementary schools, a bagged breakfast will be provided to students to eat in the classroom and a bagged lunch to take home just prior to dismissal. This is available to all students. All meals will be packaged individually and there will be no money exchange. Additionally, Grab & Go Meals will be available to all elementary students on the remote learning day (Wednesday) from 7:30 to 8:00am. Parents can drive up and pick up in front of the Hagan Elementary School (Hagan will service both elementary schools on Wednesday). Students doing full remote can pick up Grab & Go Bags at their home school from 7:30-8:00am Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday.

For students at Todd Middle School & Spackenkill High School, breakfast and lunch will be available to all students in the cafeteria when in attendance. All meals will be packaged individually and there will be no money exchange. Additionally, Grab & Go Meals will be available to all secondary students on remote learning days from 8:00-8:30am at their school. Students doing full remote can pick up Grab & Go Bags at their school from 7:00 to 7:30am.

Please note if your child is learning remotely and you need to pick up a meal at any of the school sites, you must call or email the above number with your child's name and grade to ensure a meal is available.
