May 2024 Report	The Deputy Commissioner's Monthly Report for May was distributed prior to today's meeting.	
	Jean-Marie started by explaining more about the Dutchess County Threat Assessment Group. It is a multidisciplinary group of professionals that meets to prevent targeted acts of violence. She shared that the steering committee meets regularly to review cases and participating member agencies (PMA) are still being trained and will be the eyes and ears of the community and can refer cases to the core group for review. The next task that the group is working on is establishing a public facing portal where people can make referrals to, if they have a concern. Barbara asked for a list of the Steering Committee members.	Jean-Marie will send a list of Steering Committee members out.
	Barbara asked about drug court in Dutchess County. Dr. Gary Collins has extensive experience in this area and spoke on eligibility, the steps involved once someone is in drug court, and what they must do to "graduate". Jean-Marie also spoke on how and when ITAP and supported housing programs work into this process.
