INFANT BURIALS

The Burial Book records several interments of infants. Patricia Jones (Grave Marker 680) died at the age of six months on January 21, 1941, after choking on her bottle. Gerow and Agnes Griffin (Grave Marker 661), brother and sister twins, were born prematurely at Vassar Hospital on November 26, 1939, and passed away by November 30th.

LEWIS BROWN HUBBELL

Born on March 23, 1814, Bkely in Amenia, NY, Hubbell was orphaned by his tenth birthday. He spent his life working as a farm laborer in Dutchess County, coming to the poorhouse in ill health. He died in 1874 and was buried here. His sister, Caroline Hubbell Cole, dedicated the only conventional gravestone in this cemetery to him. Hubbell was a distant relation of Edwin Powell Hubble, inventor of the Hubble Space Telescope.
