

Bicycle-Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) Meeting

Thursday, October 30, 2025, 2:30 pm via Microsoft Teams

Meeting Summary —

- **1. Introductions** Emily Dozier (DCTC) welcomed everyone to the meeting and led introductions (see list below).
- 2. Presentation: Beacon-Hopewell Rail Trail Feasibility Study Emily Dozier, DCTC

Emily provided an overview of the recently completed Feasibility Study, which she presented at Parks & Trails NY's recent Greenways Conference in Kingston. The recommendations report, which is posted on the study <u>website</u> and <u>DCTC Publications page</u>, outlines the pros, cons, and estimated costs of a Rail to Trail option and Rail with Trail option. The report recommends the Rail to Trail option.

Pat Manning noted that East Fishkill is interested in implementing a portion of the trail; Emily suggested that the Town get an updated cost estimate for the specific segment they are interested in and hire a consultant to do the design work. Pat noted that Daddy O's restaurant in Hopewell Junction is interested in a long-term lease or sale to develop a trail-oriented business. Michael O'Brien asked about ownership of the corridor; Emily noted that the County may be willing to take the property from MTA, though this has not happened yet.

Yvonne Caruthers asked about funding for construction, given the changes in priorities at the federal level. Emily noted that there is some State funding for safety projects (as the trail would provide a safe, off-road transportation corridor) as well as for parks and trails. There may also be discretionary funding from State representatives. Yvonne noted that Beacon residents are also interested in a bicycle master plan to develop a city-wide approach.

3. Partner Reports & DCTC Studies

- a. Colleen noted that Destination Dutchess' update of their Bike Tour Guide will be published and updated on their website soon.
- b. Michael O'Brien reported that a bunch of volunteers from the Hopewell Depot collected trail user surveys for Parks & Trails NY's economic impact analysis of the Empire State Trail.
- c. County Public Works: Emily shared that DPW is planning to start construction in 2026 on sidewalk and crosswalk improvements on Maple Ave in Millerton. They also have funding for improvements to the Main St/Grand Ave intersection the Town of Poughkeepsie. Finally, they are starting preliminary planning for a sidewalk extension and improvements on Jackson St in the Village of Fishkill. DCTC is working with County DPW on all of these projects.



- d. Traffic Safety Board: Emily encouraged everyone to share the resources on the <u>Watch Out For Me campaign</u>, including videos, posters and a quiz. Tracy suggested adding resources on how drivers can share the road with cyclists. Emily noted that there is a <u>video</u> (and some <u>video shorts</u>) about sharing the road, as well as a <u>brochure with tips</u>, but she welcomes suggestions for additional resources.
- e. <u>Safety Action Plan:</u> DCTC is hoping to finish this plan by the end of the year. A <u>countermeasure</u> <u>toolkit</u> is on the website. A report with suggestions for behavioral programs is coming, along with several other resources.
- f. Pedestrian/bicycle counts: Emily reviewed the data from the volunteer ped/bike counts in September, which included 20 locations. We simplified the form this year, but also added separate counts for ebikes, other electric devices, and human-powered devices. Tracy suggested counting kids on bikes separately. Johanna suggested looking at different times for the bike counts (such as Saturday or Sunday mornings), as well as other locations in Beacon, because many people avoid cycling on Main St. Emily offered that she could also help volunteers in Beacon do a broader set of counts at different locations and times. The full data will be posted on the DCTC webpage (under Traffic Data app. Emily also explained that municipalities and others can request locations for manual/volunteer or camera counts (which are done by a contractor).
- g. Steve Herschbein noted that he is working with local Repair Cafes, Vassar College, Bike Poughkeepsie, sPOKe, and others to collect, fix up, and distribute bicycles to people in need.
