





THE COURSE

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Upcoming FFY 2023-2027 TIP

5.a.i TIP update notes

- Use block PINs as temporary placeholders
 - If leftover funding is available – currently unlikely
 - Orange & Ulster counties using same approach
- Two funding programs for non-State projects:
 - STBG Large Urban
 - Off System Bridge
- Formula funds are fully programmed



Takeaway: Project sponsors need to apply for discretionary funding when available


- Study priority high-crash & highly-congested locations


5.d Regional Freight Planning







- Final report to summarize the results
