— FFY 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) — Amendment #23-05

The Dutchess County Transportation Council (DCTC) proposes an amendment to its [Federal Fiscal Year \(FFY\) 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program \(TIP\)](#), the five-year capital program that assigns federal funds to transportation projects in Dutchess County. We periodically update the TIP to add new projects, remove existing projects, or change a project's cost, schedule, or scope. We classify significant changes as amendments, which require a 15-day public comment period prior to action. Amendment #23-05 makes the following changes to the TIP:

- Adds a new project for the repaving of Route 9 from Spackenkill Rd in the Town of Poughkeepsie to West Dorsey Ln in the Town of Hyde Park by NYSDOT
- Adds federal transit funds for the purchase of 15 heavy duty buses by Dutchess County Public Transit (DCPT)
- Adds federal transit funds for the purchase of scheduling software and bus equipment by DCPT

About the DCTC: Established in 1982, the DCTC serves as the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for Dutchess County. Federal law requires that Urban Areas with over 50,000 people be represented by a MPO, which is responsible for ensuring that Federal transportation dollars (highway and transit) are committed through a locally driven, comprehensive planning process. The DCTC includes representatives from local municipalities, NYSDOT, and the MTA.
