

Executive Director: Bridget Barclay has been with the Authority since January, 1995 and was named as the Executive Director, effective January 1, 2009. She was previously appointed Assistant Director in January, 2002, and appointed to the position of Deputy Director in February 2003. Ms. Barclay holds B.A. degrees in Geography and Biology from the University of Rhode Island, and a Masters of Public Administration from Marist College, New York. Ms. Barclay has served in the past on the Village of New Paltz Planning Board, as the Vice Chairperson of the Greenway Heritage Conservancy for the Hudson River, and as a member of the Village of New Paltz Environmental Conservation Commission.

Director of Operations: Richard Winchester has been with the Authority since September 2013, working as Systems Operations and Maintenance Specialist, and was promoted to the position of Director of Operations in March of 2017. Prior to working with the Authority, Mr. Winchester worked for private operations contracting firms at a range of different sized treatment facilities, and in various roles including; Area Manager, Project Manager, Certified Water and Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator and Operations and Maintenance Specialist. In addition to operating and maintaining water treatment systems, Mr. Winchester has been involved since 1991 with upgrading existing treatment systems, constructing new treatment plants, installing water and wastewater main lines, and installing service lines. He is currently holds the following licenses and certifications; Grade 2A Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator, Grade 2B and Grade C Water Plant Operator, and Grade D Distribution System Operator.
