



TIVOLI WATER SYSTEM

Starting on May 28th, 2026

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Bring tap water to a rolling boil, boil for one minute, and cool before using. Or use bottled water certified for sale by the New York State Department of Health. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, washing dishes, brushing teeth, and preparing food until further notice.

This Boil Water Notice applies to the following areas **ONLY**:

- **Route 9G South between Broadway and Clay Hill Road**
- **Clay Hill Road**
- **Boyd Hill Lane**

What Happened?

On **May 28-29, 2026** the water system was interrupted for repairs being made for a valve and hydrant replacement within the Tivoli Water System which required the water main to be shut off for an extended period of time.

When water mains lose pressure, it increases the chance that untreated water and harmful microbes can enter your water.

Harmful microbes in drinking water can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms and may pose a special health risk for infants, some elderly, and people with severely compromised immune systems. But these symptoms are not just caused by microbes in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you should seek medical advice.

What is being done?

The repairs are being made. Upon restoration of services, water sampling will be conducted to determine if bacteria or microbes are present.

It is likely that you will need to boil water for the next 2 to 3 days until required water sampling is completed.

You will be informed when tests show that you no longer need to boil your water.
